

# History event: Winning the Vote

Next up on SI Fond du Lac's calendar is a women's history program, "March of the Women: Music for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Suffrage." The suffrage story is traced in music and poetry by a Chicago-area musician who sings and accompanies himself on the hammered dulcimer.

The program, set for two performances on Thursday, March 19, is offered as part of the Fond du Lac Public Library's "History at Home" series. It is free and open to the public. Soroptimists will host the event, provide refreshments and talk about Soroptimist and its mission.



# Empowering Voters. Defending Democracy.

We just saw history. Virginia became the 38th state to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment – crossing the three-fourths threshold of support required from the states. Now we need Congress to remove the deadline so the ERA can become a permanent part of the U.S. Constitution. When the ERA passed Congress in 1972, lawmakers attached a 1977 ratification deadline to it, which they later extended to 1982. Earlier this month, the League of Women Voters of the United States sent a letter to the United States Congress urging them to remove the ratification deadline on the ERA.

Thank you to the many League volunteers who have worked tirelessly for ratification in their states—and who continued to push for ratification even after the deadline passed. Now that the ERA has been ratified, we will not stop fighting for equality under the law and pushing to see the ERA become the next amendment to the U.S. Constitution. Women have waited decades to see the ERA pass, and this is the perfect way to kick of 2020, a year that celebrates 100 years of women's voting rights. It's time for Congress to remove the ERA deadline and make this dream a reality!

Human Traffic Awareness



Great News – The Community Outreach to Runaway Youth (CORY) Project has located all eight of the missing teens featured on the posters distributed in November/December 2019. Our next distribution will be in March. The club has also rolled out the Stop Human Trafficking Rest Room Sticker Program. This program is intended to reach out to victims of human trafficking and those who know something about a trafficking situation. Additionally, the sticker helps build awareness that Human Trafficking is a problem throughout our community. The label is placed on the inside of the rest room door. The victim or witness can discreetly take one of the eight perforated tear-off tags containing the national human trafficking hotline numbers. This can be hidden and used to call or text for help when safe to do so. The sticker is removable and leaves no residue when peeled off. It was developed and produced by the Michigan Abolitionist Project and is copyrighted. Our an-

nual planning retreat is scheduled for mid-February.

# How Michigan State Police Are Fighting Human Trafficking

MSP is working to educate motorists about the signs of human trafficking and to enforce laws that crack down on traffickers. Here's how. By Jessica Strachan, Patch Staff

MICHIGAN — During National Human Trafficking Awareness Month, Michigan State Police (MSP) motor carrier officers are teaming up with officers from neighboring states to raise awareness of human trafficking.

From Jan. 13-17, officers will join with their colleagues in the Ohio State Highway Patrol, Illinois State Police, and Indiana State Police,

along with the organization Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT) to educate motorists about the signs of human trafficking and to enforce laws that crack down on traffickers.

"We are striving to raise awareness and educate those individuals in positions to observe human trafficking taking place, such as commercial motor vehicle drivers, public transportation companies, rest area attendants and truck stop employees, "said Capt. Michael Krumm, commander of the MSP Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Division. "You are a force multiplier that can act as the eyes and ears of Michigan's highways."

The MSP first partnered with TAT in 2015 and has since been recognized as a national leader in human trafficking awareness and education. For more information about TAT, visit truckersagainsttrafficking.org.


