a Furpose For Life Introduction to a Vision – Wanting the Results

*What is "Spiritual Multiplication"? *What does it have to do with Matt 28:19-20 and 2Tim 2:2?

In Matt 28:19-20, Jesus gives his disciples what would be later called the "Great Commission"

Matt 28:19-20

"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (NAS)

The phrase "Great Commission" is not found here. It was probably chosen because it was great in size (the world's population was to be reached) and because it was like a commission (the disciples were charged with this task). Although this term is enlightening, it does not literally communicate the task. The task was to "Make Disciples. From here we can understand "disciples were to make disciples" and the concept of "reproduction" comes in to play.

2 Tim 2:2 gives us a description of what the reproductive process of "disciple-making" involves.

2 Tim 2:2

And the things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, these entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also. (NAS)

Here we see it involves innumerable generations of "disciple-makers".

- 1. The first generation disciple-maker was Paul. Paul taught Timothy. Based on Matt 28, we know that Paul had to teach Timothy how to be a disciple and how to make disciples.
- 2. The second generation disciple-maker is Timothy. He is to pass on what he learned from Paul to "faithful men".
- 3. The "third generation" disciple-makers are the "faithful men". These men are to pass on what they learn to "others also". Based on the context, we must conclude these men are faithful also.
- 4. The fourth generation disciple-makers are "other" faithful men. These men are to pass on what they learn to "others also".
- 5. The fifth generation disciple-makers are "other" faithful men. These men are to pass on what they learn to "others also".

From here it is easy to see that this reproductive process is to go on until Christ returns.

*The concept of "spiritual multiplication" can be seen from the following illustration:

Suppose we have a gifted evangelist who does an unbelievable job leading people to Christ to the extent that he is used by God to convert 10,000 people a year to Christianity. That would be 30,000 every three years. The numbers of believers associated with the evangelist is shown on the left side of the table below. In contrast to this, suppose we have a disciple-maker who also does an unbelievable job making "disciple-makers". Jesus made eleven disciple-makers in three years. So let's say the gifted disciple maker is able to make one disciple-maker every three years. The numbers associated with the disciple-maker is shown on the right in the table below. The approach on the left is addition. The approach on the right is multiplication. The approach on the left is very fulfilling but the approach on the right will reach and exceed the total population of the world today (**6,815,884,095**) in 102 years! What did Jesus have in mind as he dedicated his time to twelve for three years?

a Furpose For Life Introduction to a Vision – Defining the Terms

*What is a Disciple?

Disciple (Wikipedia) =The term "disciple" is derived from the <u>Koine Greek</u> word *mathetes*,^[1] which means a pupil (of a teacher) or an <u>apprentice</u> (to a master craftsman), coming to <u>English</u> by way of the <u>Latin discipulus</u> meaning a learner while the more common English word is student. A disciple is different from an <u>apostle</u>, which instead means a messenger.^{[2][3]} While a disciple is one who learns from a teacher, an apostle is one sent to deliver those teachings or a message

Disciple (Vine's Expository Dictionary of Biblical Words)=

A. Nouns.

1. mathetes ^3101^, lit., "a learner" (from manthano, "to learn," from a root math--, indicating thought accompanied by endeavor), in contrast to didaskalos, "a teacher"; hence it denotes "one who follows one's teaching," as the "disciples" of John, <Matt. 9:14>; of the Pharisees, <Matt. 22:16>; of Moses, <John 9:28>; it is used of the "disciples" of Jesus (a) in a wide sense, of Jews who became His adherents, <John 6:66; Luke 6:17>, some being secretly so, <John 19:38>; (b) especially of the twelve apostles, <Matt. 10:1; Luke 22:11>, e. g.; (c) of all who manifest that they are His "disciples" by abiding in His Word, <John 8:31>, cf. <13:35; 15:8>; (d) in the Acts, of those who believed upon Him and confessed Him, <6:1-2,7; 14:20,22,28; 15:10; 19:1>, etc. A "disciple" was not only a pupil, but an adherent; hence they are spoken of as imitators of their teacher; cf. <John 8:31; 15:8>.

2. mathetria ^3102^, "a female disciple," is said of Tabitha, <Acts 9:36>.#

3. summathetes ^4827^ means "a fellow disciple" (sun, with, and No. 1), <John 11:16>.# Note: In <Acts 1:15>, the RV translates the mss. which have adelphon, "brethren"; in <20:7>, RV, "we," for KJV, "disciples."

B. Verb.

1. matheteuo ^3100^ is used in the active voice, intransitively, in some mss., in <Matt. 27:57>, in the sense of being the "disciple" of a person; here, however, the best mss. have the passive voice, lit., "had been made a disciple," as in <Matt. 13:52>, RV, "who hath been made a disciple." It is used in this transitive sense in the active voice in <28:19> and <Acts 14:21>.#

All places where matheteuo ^3100^ is used

Matt 13:52 And He said to them, "Therefore every scribe who has become a <u>disciple</u> of the kingdom of heaven is like a head of a household, who brings forth out of his treasure things new and old." *What is discipleship?

Ship (Webster) = showing, exhibiting (something that can be seen/recognized)

*What then is a Disciple Maker?

One who makes disciples who show/exhibit things

Some Key verse that describes relationship between (student/teacher, disciple/disciple maker):

Matt 10:24-25 "A student is not above his teacher, nor a servant above his master. It is enough for the student to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master. If the head of the house has been called Beelzebub,(NIV) Matt 10:24-25 "A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a slave above his master. "It is enough for the disciple that he become as his teacher, and the slave as his master. If they have called the head of the house Beelzebul, how much more the members of his household!(NAS)

Matt 10:24-25 The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant above his lord. It is enough for the disciple that he be as his master, and the servant as his lord. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebub, how much more shall they call them of his household?(KJV)

*Observations from above:

"be like", "become as" and "be as" all point to doing things (actions). So, a disciple should be doing things like his disciple maker does them. In simplistic terms, a disciple then is a "copy cat". He copies what his teacher (disciple maker) does. Therefore, to be a disciple maker, one must have some things to copy. Jesus went from place to place showing his disciples what his habits looked like in various situations. His example was something to copy. Paul said "follow me as I follow Christ". A disciple maker then must display good habits to his disciple and not bad habits. This makes the disciple maker responsible for having many good habits and as few as possible bad habits. For example, a daily quiet time, a weekly bible study and a scripture memory plan are all good habits that a disciple maker may want to impart to his disciple. By necessity then, the disciple maker must have them. Based on definitions above, the disciple maker's habits must be seen by his disciple. This means the disciple must be present when the disciple maker displays his habits. This leads us to a picture of what "Christian Discipleship" looks like. One-on-one time together to do Bible study, to review scripture memory verses and time together to meet needs could be components of a good "plan for discipleship". As Jesus said, no student is above his master. This means a disciple maker should not expect his disciple to have better habits than the disciple maker himself has. This puts a burden on those wanting to be disciple makers and brings them to these questions:

1. What good habits do I want my disciple to pass on to his disciple?

2. What do I need to impart to my disciple so that he becomes an effective disciple maker?



(2 COR 4:5)

has deepened his Commitment to the Lifestyle of a Laborer, has Established Converts and Growing Christians, has Equipped Disciples and Laborers, is Leading a team of Disciples and Laborers in a Disciple Making Ministry.



a Furpose For Life Explanation of the Circle Illustration:

The Circle Illustration is meant to illustrate the possible stages a person might go through, the abilities gained in a disciple making ministry and the need for Love throughout the disciple making process.

Prior to the great commission Jesus revealed his ultimate plan for his disciples in John 17:11 which says:

"And I am no more in the world; and {yet} they themselves are in the world, and I come to Thee. Holy Father, keep them in Thy name, {the name} which Thou hast given Me, that they may be one, even as We {are.} (NAS).

The ultimate plan was that his disciples would be one with him even as he was one with the Father. In other words, he wanted his disciples to be like him. From here it is easy to see the need to reproduce his likeness into his disciples which would result in him reproducing himself through them. Indeed, when we look closely at the great commission, the reproduction process is clear and it extends to the disciples of the disciples (because they are to teach their disciples all that he had taught them).

Matt 28:19-20 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (NAS)

The reproductive process of disciple making is clearly in Paul's ministry when we look at 2 Tim 2:2 which says:

And the things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, these entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also. (NAS)

The reproductive process is limited to where the disciple maker is spiritually:

Matt 10:24-25a "A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a slave above his master. "It is enough for the disciple that he become as his teacher, and the slave as his master....(NAS)

The Bible does not provides us detailed plans for a disciple making ministry but it does say this about plans: Prov 16:9 "A man's heart plans his way, But the LORD directs his steps." NKJV

The circle illustration is a plan from the heart of a man seeking to make disciples and fulfill the great commission. It has helped this man set personal goals for himself and propose personal goals for others. The reader should realize that the key to success is not in the plan but in seeking the Lord's direction every step of the way. The author believes a good reference for coming up with a disciple making plan can be found in the book: The lost Art of Disciple Making" by Leroy Eims.

"In this illustration", the **circles** represent stages of development. Key objectives for each stage of development are inside each circle. A comparison of the objectives show an increase of good habits and abilities as development progresses.

"In this illustration", The **arrows** represent expected abilities. For example, a NEW BELIEVER and a GROWING CHRISTIAN have no arrows coming out of them because, they are not expected to be able to reach out and help others. In this illustration, the DISCIPLE is expected to be able to lead people to Christ and follow them up so that they reach the GROWING CHRISTIAN stage. Going through the NEW BELIEVER and GROWING CHRISTIAN stages has taught the DISCIPLE much of what he needs to know. The Laborer will help him know more and put this knowledge into action. The LABORER is expected to be able to help someone become a DISCIPLE. He can do this because the LABORER has been through all three previous stages and he has the council of the Leader to guide him. Finally the LEADER develops. He is able to do everything a LABORER can do because the LEADER has been through all previous stages and his LEADER has taught him additional things he needs to know.

Introduction to a Vision – Executing the Plan

Paul, a disciple maker, was controlled by love during his disciple making ministry as can be seen in the following passage:

2 Cor 5:11-15 "Therefore, being conscious of fearing the Lord with respect *and* reverence, <u>we seek to win</u> people over [to persuade them]. But what sort of persons we are is plainly recognized *and* thoroughly understood by God, and I hope that it is plainly recognized *and* thoroughly understood also by your consciences (your inborn discernment). We are not commending ourselves to you again, but we are providing you with an occasion *and* incentive to be [rightfully] proud of us, so that you may have a reply for those who pride themselves on surface appearances [on the virtues they only appear to have], although their heart is devoid of them. For if we are beside ourselves [mad, as some say], it is for God *and* concerns Him; if we are in our right mind, it is for your benefit, For the love of Christ controls *and* urges *and* impels us, because we are of the opinion *and* conviction that [if] One died for all, then all died; And He died for all, so that all those who live might live no longer to *and* for themselves, but to *and* for Him Who died and was raised again for their sake." AMP

John 13:34-35 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." NIV

Paul, Peter and John emphasized this mark to their disciples:

Rom 13:8 Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellowman has fulfilled the law. NIV

1 Peter 1:22 Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere love for your brothers, love one another deeply, from the heart. NIV

1 John 4:7 Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. NIV

1 John 3:23 And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us. NIV

Conclusion:

Therefore, when it comes to Spiritual Multiplication, remember this: **1 Cor 16:14** Do everything in love. NIV

They do not know, nor do they understand, for He has smeared over their eyes so that they cannot see and their hearts so that they cannot comprehend. And no one recalls, nor is there knowledge or understanding to say, "I have burned half of it in the fire, and also have baked bread over its coals. I roast meat and eat it. Then I make the rest of it into an abomination, I fall down before a block of wood!" He feeds on ashes; a deceived heart has turned him aside. And he cannot deliver himself, nor say, "Is there not a lie in my right hand?" (NAS)

From Russell Kelfer's "Spiritual Gifts: How to Discern Your Gift"

A. A Spiritual Gift is not a Talent

1. Talent is a natural ability given at birth cultivated with use

(for example, music, art, writing, mechanical inclinations are talents). A Spiritual Gift is a supernatural ability given at conversion

2. Talent is your ability to relate yourself to the world. Spiritual Gift is your ability to relate God to the world

3. Talent draws honor and attention to yourself as you are identified with you abilities. A Spiritual Gift draws honor and attention to God as you become transparent and people are drawn to Christ.

4. You receive physical and emotional freedom by the use of your talent. You receive Spiritual freedom, exhilaration and joy when you use your Spiritual Gift in the Spirit.

Note: A Temperament is those attribute of the natural man personality drives acquired through birth. Talents are usable but inflatable. Temperament are usable but have diminishing returns as we grow spiritually.

1. Your temperament is your basic emotional drive. Your gift is your basic spiritual drive.

2. Your temperament is inherited from your parents for the most part at your natural birth. Your gift is given to you at your new birth by a sovereign God.

3. Your temperament governs your actions and reactions in the flesh. Your gift governs your actions and reactions in the Spirit.

4. Your temperament should decrease in importance as you grow in Christ. Your gift should increase in importance as you grow in Christ.

C. A Spiritual Gift is not a Calling

1. A Calling is a distinct call from God to engage in a specific area of ministry in the body of Christ. Your calling is what you do. Your Gift is your motivating drive.



The Hand Illustration



UNDERSTAND, REMEMBER AND APPLY THE HAND ILLUSTRATION

HEARING THE WORD - *Hearing the word from godly pastors and teachers provides us insight into others' study of the Scriptures and it stimulates our own desire to understand God's Word. We hear the Word when we listen to godly pastors and teachers explain their understanding of what God is saying in the Bible.

READING THE WORD - *Reading the Word gives us an overall picture of what God has said and done in the past. When you look off the top of a tall building you get an overall picture of the city that the building is in but you can't see details very clearly from up there.

STUDYING THE WORD - *Studying the Word gives us a close-up picture of what God is saying in the Bible. It's like looking through a telescope when we are on the top of a tall building. The telescope helps us see the things that are going on in the city below more clearly.

We study the Word when answer questions as we read it. The following are some sample questions:

- 1. Who wrote this passage?
- 2. Who was he writing to?
- 3. What is he trying to communicate?
- 4. Why is he writing these things to these people?

MEMORIZING THE WORD - *Memorizing the Word helps us to overcome Satan and temptation (Ps 119:9.11) and it helps us draw near to God (Col 3:2,3). We have memorized a verse when we are able to quote it word perfect without looking at it. The only way to keep a verse memorized is to review it frequently.

MEDITATING ON THE WORD - *Meditating on the Word gives us a deeper understanding of God and his will for us. We can meditate on the word when we hear it, read it, study it and memorize it! We are meditating on the Word when we answer these questions:

1. How does this passage help me understand God better?

2. How does this passage help me understand what God's wants me to do?


How to Memorize a Verse Effectively

Guidelines for Memorizing a Verse of Scripture

- 1. Work on the verses audibly whenever possible.
- 2. Learn the topic and the reference first.
- 3. Add the first phrase to the topic and reference.
- After you have reviewed the first phrase, reference, and topic a few times, add the second phrase. Gradually add phrases till you know the whole verse.
- 4 5. As you memorize and review the verse, think about how it applies to your own life.
 - 6. Always review the verse in this sequence:
 - a. TOPIC: "Assurance of Salvation"
 - b. REFERENCE: "First John five, eleven and twelve"
 - c. VERSE(S): "And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; he who
 - does not have the Son of God does not have life."



7.) The most important time to review a verse repeatedly is right after you can repeat the whole (topic, reference, verse, reference) without making a mistake. Review the verse a minimum of once daily after that, preferably several times a day for a few days. Some people say that they cannot memorize. In reality, most people tend to have short memories. God has given us a "forgetter," and there are some things we should forget. God has also given us the capacity to remember. But we must apply the basic principles of memory to do this. The primary principle is REVIEW. A verse is learned, partially forgotten, relearned, partially forgotten, and relearned again. The relearning process takes progressively less time till forgetting is replaced by knowing. The following diagram illustrates this:

Overview of Required Work:

The required work is divided into two parts. The first part will prepare you for the second part.

Part 1-Preparation for Workshop:

(This can be done alone using the provided materials)

Your goal in this part will be to write two drafts of your testimony using the materials provided. To be ready for the workshop in **Part 2**, you should proceed as follows:

- a. Look at this section while listing to the tape. Make notes in this section as required while listening.
- b. Write the first draft of your testimony using the material provided and your notes.
- c. Read your testimony out loud while recording it if possible.
- d. Analyze your recording as though you were the instructor and the testimony you are hearing was a testimony of someone you are helping. Use the material provide to do the evaluation. (You may want to listen to the tape again before you begin.)
- e. Re-write your testimony. (This will be the second draft that is required for **Part 2**)

Part 2-Workshop Execution:

(Will be done with others in small and large groups.)

Your goal in this part will be to learn how to help others develop there testimony and to give your testimony from a 3×5 card to others. To be ready for this part ,you should have evaluated your own testimony using the materials provided and have written your second draft. You need to bring the second draft with you to the Workshop.

Three Issues To Keep In Mind As We Prepare Our Testimony

- The material in this guide is designed to produce a testimony that is best suited for <u>Non-Christian</u> listeners (i.e. those who have no church background or understanding of Christian principles and Christian terms). (Some modifications should be made if it is to be given to Christians. Such as, add 2 or 3 scripture references and Christian terms, etc.)
- The material in this guide is designed to produce a testimony that is best suited for <u>conversational</u> sharing <u>one-on-one</u> or in a <u>small group</u>. It is not designed for large groups of Christians. (Some modification should be made if it is to be given to large groups.)
- This testimony is designed to be a <u>door opener</u> not a convincing tool. We are not going to try to convince a person to come to Christ with this testimony. What we do want to do is to give a person the impression that something has happen to us related to the person of Christ that has changed and enriched our life.

B. Guidelines for Preparing the More Specific Content

Twelve Principles That Are Very Helpful When Writing/Analyzing Your Testimony

Make it sound conversational; to be spoken, not read.

Say "I" and "ME" not "YOU". (Share don't preach.)

Avoid religious words, phrases and jargon. Avoid technical words, phrases and jargon.

Generalize so more people can identify with your story. Don't give names of specific churches/denominations, details of battle with sin, specific ages/dates, etc.

Include some humor or human interest. This and smiling often relaxes and disarms people.

One or two word pictures increase interest to help the listener visualize/relate to the story.

Include both good and bad aspects of your life in the "BEFORE" part of your testimony.

In the "HOW", we do three things

- a. Communicate the Gospel clearly and briefly including the following: Fact of Sin Penalty of Sin Christ Paid the Penalty Must Receive Christ (Avoid quoting verses here; paraphrased scripture instead.
- b. Make the Bible the Authority. Do not give the impression that the person speaking to you was the authority.
- c. Use the word "pray" when referring to receiving Christ into your life.

9. In the "AFTER" rapidly conclude with 2 or 3 personal benefits. The last sentence in you testimony should have a statement like this:

"but the greatest benefit is to know for certain that I have eternal life."

10. Avoid dogmatic statements which skeptics can question.

11. Sound adult not juvenile.

12. Simplify & reduce clutter to make the story easy to follow and truth easy to find.

The Sequence of Your Preparation

- 1. Before you start pray for Gods Help and Insight
- 2. Accumulate brief notes on three sheets of paper labeled Before, How, and After. Jot down anything that comes to mind (brainstorm type notes)
- 3. Write out first draft using notes on three sheets of paper and guideline. Record it if you have a recorder. It should take about 3-5 minutes to read aloud.
- 4. Make improvement in the long draft applying the 12 guidelines creating the second draft.

- 5. Cut your draft down to between 2.5 to 3 minutes at the training Clinic.
- 6. Outline your 3-4 minute testimony on a 3 x 5 card at training Clinic.
- 7. Learn to give your testimony only using your 3 x 5 card during the clinic.

8. Learn to give your testimony in 3-4 minutes without the outline before you teach others.

Common pit-falls To Avoid When Preparing Drafts:

- A. Too Consciensious in the First Draft (Want it to be too perfect too soon)
- B. Too Much Reminiscing

-Become Sad or Depressed During the Story because of too much Introspection

-Get Stuck Reliving the Past Instead Of Writing the Story

-Too much time Trying To Reconcile Old Conflicts

- C. Introduce Spiritual Content Too Early or Too Often. (Introduce Yourself as a Person First.)
- D. Worry Too Much About When You Were Converted (Can use Lordship Commitment as focus of Conversion Date Unclear by putting 4 parts of Gospel Close to Your Lordship Prayer)
- E. Procrastinating Because This Is A Hard Assignment

Example of <u>my first written testimony</u> (version 1975)

Man has walked through the ages in many winding paths; Picking up bits and pieces and wondering what he has. Many say they have the answer, but how am I to know? Which one is right or wrong; which way should I go?

Stumbling, fumbling, like a blinded baby boy; Searching for a golden road in life that leads a life to joy. I follow no direction; only a leading that's inside me;. It is something that is pure and good - what can it be?

Roaming, searching, trying to find truth; Like grabbing something hard to grab, always slipping loose. Walking, wandering, from road to road; Seeking the truth, a path made of gold.

There must be more to life than working everyday;. The answer must be some truth unfound, can there be another way? The answer to this question escapes me all the time; It seems I have all the answers, except the one I seek to find.

The years of my life, I see slowly slipping by; The reason that I am here today, I really don't know why. Questions, questions, a never ending number; Oh, let me rest inside that I might find slumber.

The world seems so dark and cold; getting darker every day; I wish, I wish with all my heart that I might find the way. But this truth I seek to find is not plain to see. Should I sit and scratch my head and just wonder what will be?

Some say they found the answer; while others search far and wide. For me, I think this search starts within me deep inside. It's a search for what's right and wrong - this is what I feel; A search for meaning in life - a search for what is real.

Another shows me a book of truth, that leads to a life of gold;
As I read it. I begin to see the purpose of life unfold.
It's a life full of meaning and riches more than I can say;
My quest is taking shape I see, more clear becomes the way!

The road I seek is straight and narrow - not a winding path; It leads to joy unmeasured and to happiness that lasts. Now I have found the truth I sought, it's in the one who paid the price. The answer to all my questions is a <u>risen</u> Jesus Christ!

Example of my testimony after receiving training (version 2003)

BEFORE:

I grew up in a big city. In a part of town that had a reputation for being a trouble spot, a place where <u>police</u> <u>sirens often filled the night</u>. Even my home was a trouble spot. My parents could not get along and would often fight at night. Our neighbors didn't like "all the noise at 3 am" and their kids would often tease me about it. This deeply <u>hurt my feelings</u> because it told me "nobody cared about me". I got mad and <u>stopped listening</u> to my parents and did <u>what I wanted</u> to do. <u>I did a lot of bad things to get "attention" and "fit in"</u>. It proved I was brave and not scared of anything and it stopped all the teasing. The things I did to "fit in" got more dangerous and I began to realize I would self-destruct if I continued. So, I jumped at the first opportunity to leave that city and prepare for a future. I got a great job and started to go to college at night. I cleaned up a lot of things in my life because it helped me helped me make progress toward career and social goals. As I started to see how far I could go socially, my moral and ethical standards got worse and worse. Then a guy moved in next to me who said he was a "drummer" in a gospel "rock band". I thought that was strange because I didn't know that a "Christian" could be a drummer or be in a "rock band". This guy was also different in other ways. He seemed to strongly believe that he had a personal relationship with God and seemed to be happy about it.

HOW:

One day, as we got to know each other better, he invited me to a "Mother's Day" gospel rock concert". The name was strange and I really didn't think I would like the music but I went anyway to make him feel better. When I got there, I was surprised by the music, "It really was rock music" ... but the words were about God. The thing that surprised me the most was the joy I saw in the people around me who were singing the words. I had never seen anything like that before. After the music stopped, a guy about my age came out on the stage all by himself. He was very excited and he read from the Bible as he talked about God and God's plan for people. He showed where the Bible says people are separated from God because they want to do things their way instead of God's way. He said this rebellious attitude offends God and the penalty for this offense was death and eternal suffering. He said Jesus paid this penalty when he sacrificed his life on the cross. He said it was up to me to decide if I wanted forgiveness. What I would have to do was pray to God, admit that I was rebellious, believe that Jesus died for my sins and ask God to take control of my life. Well, I had never heard anything like that before. All this made me wonder about God's existence. Then I began wonder if what he was saying was true. Could God see what was in my heart? Did Jesus care enough to die for my sins? What could God do with my life if I gave it to Him? Well, I decide that I needed to determine if what he said was true. I also decided it would have to come from the Bible and not from people's opinions of the Bible. I read the Bible every day after that night; about twenty chapters a day! The more I read about Jesus, the more I realized he was brave and not scared of anything. This was something I could relate to. The difference was he was not doing it to "get attention" or "fit in". He was doing it because it was just right! And as I read, I also came to realize that Jesus cared for people like me, who had a bad home-life. I began to spend more time with that drummer and people began to pray for me. I read the Bible daily and amazed people with how much I understood. But I knew I would not be a Christian until I gave God control over my life. The idea scared me because I didn't know what God would tell me to do after I gave him control! Finally, one Sunday, during a church service, I couldn't resist it any longer and I prayed to God. I admitted I had been running my own life and was separated from Him. Then I prayed for forgiveness and asked God to take control of my life.

AFTER:

I immediately felt close to God, something I had never felt before. I knew I had done ALL that God wanted me to do and there was no reason to be scared of what God would do. After church, the singles that I was with were trying to decide where we would go for lunch. I looked around and realized everything was different; everything was new. It didn't matter where we went to lunch; the thing that did matter was that <u>God finally had</u> <u>control of my life</u>! I stopped worrying about how I could fit into people's plans and started trying to understand God's plan. I began to experience an inner strength that helped me replace a lot of bad habits with a lot of good habits. But the probably greatest benefit of becoming a Christian is to know for certain that I have eternal life.

Related Studies and Illustrations

1.My Word Study of "Perseverance"

I. INTRODUCTION

A. Definition

Definitions of some words related to PERSEVERANCE (from American Heritage Dictionary):

PERSEVERE - to persist in or remain constant to a purpose, idea, or task in the face of obstacles or discouragement.

<u>Preserve</u> - to keep in an unaltered condition; maintain in an unchanged form.

Endure - to carry on through, dispite hardships; to suffer patiently without yielding; persevere.

The idea behind perseverance is to preserve our faith; that is, to maintain our faith as we go through a trial. Perseverance can be thought of as the moment-by-moment aspect of endurance.

Some words that are used in the Bible to describe perseverance (see Appendix A for more detail) are:

ABIPE bear/borne continue/continually devote endure/endurance forbear/forbearance hold (fast) overcome patience/long suffering persisted put up with remain stand (firm) stay (there) steadfast suffer/suffering wait

B. Description

John Gills, a puritan author of the early 1700's describes a Christian with perserverance as a "tough saint able to be humble, self denying, submissive to the will of God and patient toward all men...yet showing firmness of mind, resolution, an UNDAWNIED courage, and fortitude of soul."

As we go through this work shop, we will see that Christian perserverance:

- Concerns itself with the will of God
- Is exercised in obedience to God's will
- Is done because it is man's duty and this satisfies him
- Is done with a pure view to the honor and glory of God

- Is done trusting in and depending on God's power, strength, and grace
- Is done believing that God will carry one through the events that he has been called to
- Is not being deterred by any difficulty that occurs, or dangers that may result in accomplishing God's will
- Is always preceded by a choice; a choice to keep on doing the will of God or stop
- Is necessary in a Christian's life

II. THE NECESSITY OF PERSEVANCE

Paul compared the Christian life to the life of an athlete who trained for the olympic games (I Cor. 9: 24-27). He points out that he who runs in the games should run to win (I Cor. 9:24).

Discipline and endurance is required in both the life of an athlete and the Christian. Both the athelete and the Christian have a course to run. Luke points out that John the Baptist was nearly finishing his course (Acts 13:25). John's course required that he live the life of a Nazerite (Num. 6:2, 3) (Luke 1:15) in the desert (Luke 3: 1-3), be imprisoned, and be beheaded by Herod (Matt 14: 3-12). Paul had a course to run and could say he had finished it while fighting a good fight (II Tim 4: 7). Paul's course required that he be rejected in Iconium (Acts 13: 51, 52; 14: 1-5), stoned in Lystra (Acts 14: 6-20), thrown into prison (Acts 16: 16-34), saved from an angry mob (Acts 19: 13-41), imprisoned for two years (Acts 24: 27), be shipwrecked on his way to Rome (Acts 27: 26-44), and be rejected by the Jews in Rome (Acts 28: 17-29).

Jesus came to do God's will and finish the work God the Father gave him to do (John 17: 4). After completing the work, Jesus could say "it is finished" (John 19: 30). The course that Jesus was on led him through many trials, afflictions, and to the cross (Mark 15: 16-24).

What will be along the way of the Christian's course? Paul urged his followers to bear the weaknesses of those without strength (Romans 15: 1); to bear one anothers burdens (Gal. 6:2); to persevere in prayer (Eph. 6: 18); to endure hardship (II Tim 4: 5); and to have great patience (II Tim. 3: 10). We also know that all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution (II Tim. 3: 12).

Paul tells us that suffering is part of the ministry (II Tim. 1: 8) and we are co-heirs with Christ if we share in his suffering (Rom. 8: 17). Jesus said repeatedly that he who endures to the end shall be saved (Matt. 10: 22, Matt. 24: 13, Mark 13: 13) and he told his disciples that perserverance would win their souls (Luke 21: 19).

The writer of Hebrews said we belong to Christ if we hold fast our confidence and boosting FIRM until the end (Heb. 3: 6). Paul said we have been reconciled to God if we continue in the faith and not be moved away from the hope of the gospel (Co. 1:23).

After we find out the course God has called us to, we must make up our mind to finish the course. This will take perserverance. Obstacles to God's work and demands on us will always pop in the course of doing God's will.

III. PERSEVERANCE & THE WILL OF GOD

A. Acting in Obedience

The issue at stake regarding PERSEVERANCE is whether or not we will obey God, overcoming the consequences of our faith and being found blameless. The Christian who perservers is the one who clearly sees this issue and does not loose sight of it. He has made up his mind to do the will of God. Joshua made up his mind to serve the Lord and not other gods (Josh. 24: 15). The consequence of that decision let him into the task of conquering a foreign land, the results being that the people who were under him served the Lord all their lives (Josh. 24: 31). Peter and John made up their minds to keep on preaching what they had seen and heard (Acts 4: 19-20). The consequences of that decision led to trials of church leadership but resulted in strength to the brethren and church growth (Acts 4: 31-32). Jesus (as was prophesized by Isaiah 52: 7) set his face like flint so as to not depart from the path that God the Father had laid out for him and the consequences of that decision was the cross, but the result was man being brought back to God (I Pet. 3:18).

B. Following God's Direction

Since PERSEVERANCE starts with obedience to the Will of God, it will continually be required of us as we follow God's direction. Paul was called as an apostle over the church of Phillipi. Obedience to this call gave Paul a closeness to God that allowed him to "endure" all things for the sake of those who were chosen for salvation" (II Tim. 2:10). Paul had a course to run, a fight to finish (II Tim. 4:7). Paul knew he would "continue" with all the Phillipians for their progress and joy in the faith (Phil. 1:25).

Following God's direction can result in hardships and sufferings. The writer of Hebrews advises us that growth will result if we view hardships as a form of discipline from the Lord (Heb. 12:7). Paul had accepted the fact that suffering was part of the ministry (II Tim. 1:8). Paul was determined to endure all things so that he would not hinder the effect of the gospel (I Cor. 9:12).

C. Walking by Faith

Perserverance requires that we walk by faith in times of trials trusting God's wisdom and sovereignty. Job perservered as he acknowledged God's sovereignty (Job 2: 9-10). Faith is the substance of things unseen (Heb. 11: 1). Paul looked to the unseen and saw his suffering as "momentary" and "light" compared to "the eternal weight" of glory it would bring (II Cor. 4: 17-18). Moses endured because he had come to depend on God and look to him who was unseen at that time (Heb. 11: 27). The writer of Hebrews exhorts us to set aside the distraction of sin and run with endurance the race set before us, not fixing our eyes on this world but on the risen savior (Heb. 12: 1-3) who we see by faith. As John put it "our faith is the victory that overcomes the world" (I John 5:4) and it is our faith that will help us perservere.

D. Motivated by Examples

It is God's design that we be motivated by the example of others. The writer of Hebrews reminds us to consider the things that Jesus endured in his last days so that we would not become weary or fainthearted (Heb. 2:18). He also exhorts us to be immitators of those who through faith inherited a promise (Heb. 6: 12). Paul said patient endurance is produced in us as we see others endure suffering (II Cor. 1: 6). We are exhorted to have the same attitude Jesus had (Phil. 2: 5) and to follow the example of Paul (Phil. 3: 17). James encourages us to look to the suffering and patience of the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord (James 5:10).

E. Moved by Love

Finally PERSEVERANCE without a love of God is impossible. Only through love can we bear and endure all things (I Cor. 13: 7). James indicates the love of the Lord is in those who perservere (James 1:12). Our love for God is what enables us to keep his commandments (I John 5: 3) thereby accomplishing his will.

F. Summary

1) Accept God's Will

Once we understand what God's will is for us, we need to accept it, and acting in obedience, move forward following God's direction. We must walk by faith, motivated by love, knowing that His will is good and acceptable and perfect (Rom. 12: 2, Jn. 14: 21). That doesn't mean that there will be no opposition; in fact, it often is God's will that we go through opposition in doing His will. James tells us that the testing of our faith through such trials produces steadfastness, which, in its full effect, makes us complete, lacking in no spiritual thing (James 1: 3-4). In the "Faith Hall of Fame" there is a passage (Heb. 11: 35b-38) that describes some of the tough trials faithful people go through.

So, God's will isn't always easy; but it's always best. And it is God's will that we go through trials (rather than around them) in our lives, for our suffering through trials produces endurance, which produces character, which produces hope; and hope doesn't disappoint us because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit (Rom. 5: 3-5). He helps us to perservere if we walk in His way and not turn to the left or to the right. (JosH 1:7)

2) Be Committed to Perservere

Having the mental resolve to endure whatever trial God brings us through is important (II Tim. 2: 10). Most of the people who have 'dropped back 15 yards and punted' their faith because of a trial never committed themselves to perservere through a trial. "For you have need of endurance, so that you may do the will of God and receive what is promised" (Heb. 10:36, RSV). If we are committed to perservere, then we can accomplish God's will. And there is fulfillment in doing God's will. Jesus found it fulfilling (it was His 'food') to do God's will and accomplish the work of God (John 4:34). Jesus was able to accomplish the work God gave Him to do because He overcame the world (John 16: 33; 17: 4). Timothy was exhorted to always be steady, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, and fulfill his ministry (II Tim. 4: 5). And if we commit ourselves to perservere, and 'set our face like a flint,' God helps us to perservere and not to be put to shame (Isa. 50: 7); He strengthens us and upholds us with His victorious right hand (Isa. 41: 10). And indeed, "Blessed is the man who endures trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life which God has promised to those who love Him" (James 1:12).

3) Look to Jesus

Jesus, the God-Man, is our best example of how to perservere through trials and obstacles. Now that we have accepted God's will and committed ourselves to endure whatever obstacles may occur, let us run with perserverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfector of our faith: consider Him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted (Heb. 12: 1-3). Look in the gospels at the life of Jesus. He accepted the work His Father set before Him (John 4: 34). He was committed to perservere through all obstacles in His path - the Pharisees (Mt. 16: 1-4)), the masses (John 6: 22-40), the disciples ignorance (Mt. 9: 14-29) and Satan (Mt. 4: 1-11). And He won - He accomplished all the Father asked Him to do.

IV. PERSEVERANCE AND GOD'S GRACE

A. Love When We Don't Deserve It

God loves us dispite the fact that we don't deserve his love (Rom. 5: 8). That's grace! His love for us compells him to give us hardships to help us grow spiritually. That's grace too! The writer of Hebrews exhorts us to view these hardships as the discipline of God (Heb. 12: 5-7).

B. Strength When We Need It

An abundance of strength is available in Christ to carry out the will of God. For God has not given us a spirit of fear but of power (II Tim. 1:7). We are to stand firm in the faith and be strong (I Cor. 16: 18). The Pslamist said the Lord was the strength of his life (Ps. 28: 7). So it must be when we are called upon to persevere. We must not depend on our strength. For our adequacy is from the Lord (II Cor. 3: 5). This is how the church of Ephesus perserved and endured without growing weary (Rev. 2: 3). We need to be strengthened with all power by God if we are to become steadfast and patient (Col. 1: 11). We need to be strong if we are to overcome the evil one (I John 2:14).

C. Rewards If We Do It

The Bible clearly teaches that those who *PERSEVERE* in doing God's will will obtain rewards by God. Paul said that we are looking for glory, honor, and immortality, by perservering in good deeds (Rom. 2: 7) and he said we will reap if we do not faint (Gal. 6: 9-10). Jesus said that he who overcomes will be given authority over nations (Rev. 2: 26), he will inherit the new Jerusalem and become God's son (Rev. 21: 7); he will be granted the tree of life, the crown of life, freedom of the second death, and a new name (Rev. 2: 7-25). He will be clothed in white *GARMENTS*, always have his name in the book of life, have his name confessed before the Father and his angles (Rev. 3: 5, 11). He will be made a pillar in the temple of God, have God's name, the name of God's city, and have Christ's new name written on Him (Rev. 3: 11, 12), and he will sit down with Christ on his thrown (Rev. 3: 21). James said that he who perservers will receive the crown of life (James 1: 12).

A. Find the Will of God

"For I know the plans that I have for you declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for calamity to give you a future and a hope." (Jer. 29:11)

God has a wonderful plan for our lives and it is up to us to find out what that plan is. This sheet will offer some steps that will help a believer find the will of God for himself.

Step 1 The Revealed Will of God: God's revealed will is in his Word the Bible. In the Bible we find that God's will for us is our sanctification (I Thess. 4:3).

> As we read and study the Bible we get acquainted with God. The more time we spend with God in this way, the better we understand Him, His character, and His will for us.

> Start with the Bible when looking for God's will. Topical studies are often helpful in this regard. Jesus will not change. He is the same today as yesterday (Heb. 13:8). His will for a particular person in the past as recorded by the Bible could be his will for you. Study God's Word and pray!

- Step 2 Godly Counselors: If God's will is still not clear after studying the Revealed Will of God, you may need the help of a Godly Counselor, one who has been applying God's word to his life for a long period of time. For example, a godly couple who have been married for 30 years often make the best premarital counselors. There is victory in the midst of many counselors (Prov. 24:6). Listen to godly counsel and pray!
- Step 3 Circumstances: That's right, look at circumstances last! God has used circumstances to communicate His will, but we should not be lead to think that God will only use circumstances; nor should we think that a review of circumstances is a substitute for a study of the revealed will of God or counsel from a godly couple. Review your circumstances and pray!

Several good books that discuss finding God's Will in detail are available in local Christian book stores. The writer recommends the following:

A good book that describes how to do a topical bible study is The Navigator Bible Study Handbook; NAVPRESS. B. Planning to Perservere

"The plans of the diligent lead surely to advantage" (Proverbs 21:5)

After we find God's will, we need to work it into our schedule and keep it there. Often the reason we can't is that we have an impossible schedule to keep up with and we try to fit just one more thing into it. Another reason is that we just procrastinate and don't get started. If you can identify with either of these situations, what may help you is to go through the process of developing <u>Purposes</u>, <u>Goals</u>, and <u>Objectives</u> for your life.

- 1) Purposes/Goals/Objectives Definitions
 - a) Purpose: This always answers a "why" question.
 - i. The purpose is the Biblical basis for why we establish goals in every area of our lives. When someone asks the purpose for establishing goals, we should be able to tell them why we are spending our lives to accomplish these goals. They must be Biblically directed for us to know that they are from God.
 - ii. Goals and objectives relate to the purpose for which God has established our existence.
 - iii. A purpose is something for which we ultimately hope.
 - iv. A purpose is not necessarily measurable in itself, but it is a clear direction toward which we wish to move.
 - b) Goal: This always answers a "what" question.
 - The goal explains what we are trusting God to do in our lives to fulfill his purpose for our existence.
 - It is a future event towards which we can measure progress of accomplishing the God given purpose in life.
 - iii. A goal is a statement of faith.
 - iv. Guidelines on how to establish goals and the power of goals are discussed on other sheets.
 - c) Objectives: This always answers a "how" question.
 - An objective explains how we believe God wants to accomplish the goal He has given us.
 - ii. There can be several objectives for accomplishing one goal.
 - iii. This is an activity which will enable us to see progress toward completion of the goal in a given timeframe.

- 2) The Art of Establishing Purposes/Goals/Objectives
 - a) Spend time with God and His word.
 - b) Ask God to give you specific purposes toward each area of life, i.e., God, family, ministry, career and other.
 - i. Ask God to give you promises, commands and his desires from the Word.
 - ii. Write out:
 - a. The verses that gave you the purposes.
 - b. In your own words why you believe God directed you to these verses.
 - c. Why He wants you to establish each purpose.
 - iii. Pray over the verses and your explanation.
 - iv. Claim these purposes and verses as the ones God wants you to direct your life toward.
 - c) Repeat paragraph one and two above only direct your thoughts and efforts toward goals.
 - i. Write out the goals God wants you to establish to see Him achieve the purpose in each area of life.

ii. Relate each goal to a specific purpose in life.

- iii. Place each goal into a specific timeframe, i.e., 6 months, 1 year, 2 years, 3 years, 4 years and 5 years.
- iv. Establish goals in ten year periods for the next 50 years.
- Repeat paragraph one and two above only direct your thoughts and efforts toward objectives.
 - Be specific; detailed; include dates and quantities when writing objectives.
 - ii. Most objectives for accomplishing each goal will normally change from one timeframe to the next.
 - iii. Relate each objective to each goal in each specific timeframe.

C. How to Perservere

or

"What Do You Do Do When the Bottom Drops Out?"

A) Cry Out to God

Let Him know how you feel - be honest with Him. There is a season for everything; "a time to weep, a time to laugh, a time to mourn, and a time to dance" (Ecclesiastes 3: 4). There will be times that we hurt badly, and our Heavenly Father wants us to tell Him about it. There is comfort in releasing our feelings to God.

Some Biblical examples of men crying out to God are:

Job - Job 7: 7-21 David - Psalms 3, 17, 42, 43, 51, 109 (and many more) Nehemiah - Nehemiah 1: 4-11 Jesus - Matthew 26: 36-46 (in the Garden of Gethsemene)

- B) Focus on
 - 1) God's Sovereignty

God is in control (Proverbs 21: 1); He has hedged His protective power about us, and nothing can happen to us without His permission (Job 1: 10; see also I Corinthians 10: 13).

- 2) God's Concerns
 - a) His Glory Isaiah 42: 8; 48: 10, 11
 'How is God going to glorify Himself through this trial?'
 - b) My good (in His purpose) Romans 8:28 'How is God going to use this trial in my life?'
 - c) His Gosepl Matthew 28: 19-20 'How is God going to use this trial to promote His Gospel?'
 - d) His Children Rom. 8: 31-32 'Could God be using this trial in others lives?'
- 3) God's Word

Meditate on God's Word - He often reveals great and wonderful things about Himself during trials.

- 4) Our Response to God
 - a) Submit to God and Trust Him

Give the trial up to God and let Him deal with you through the trial, and bring the trial to His purposed (and as yet unseen) conclusion (II Corinthians 4: 17-18). Model Jesus' example of submission to the Father at Gethsemene (Matthew 26: 36-46).

b) Develop a Proper Perspective

"Shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil?" (Job 2: 10). Obeying and following Jesus doesn't mean that bad things won't happen to us. Every day we interact with sinners, and one of them may bring misery into our life. And being a Christian doesn't mean God will deliver us out of a trial "smelling like a rose"; this is a prideful attitude. God sometimes uses trials to humble us, so that we can grow spiritually.

C) Find a counselor (or counselors) you can comfortably share with to help you get through a trial (Proverbs 15: 22, 24: 6). Often times, in the midst of a trial, a high level of emotional anxiety is present which affects our ability to reason properly. Godly counselors can be helpful to us as objective listeners who are not involved in our trial, and thus can help us learn what God wants to teach us by the trial.






Applying the Bible - Explanation of the Prism Illustration:

The Prism Illustration shows two states of man, the natural man (above) and the new man (below). The new man wants to please God, the natural man does not. <u>The will</u> of the new man directs God's intentions through the heart into actions. The old man is simply not willing to let this happen.

So the point of the illustration is this: We as Christians need to be <u>willing</u> to seek, understand and become the will of God no matter what it is.

- Seeking requires an act of the will and involves time in the Bible.
- Understanding requires an act of the will and involves looking for what matters to God not what matters to me.
- Becoming requires an act of the will and involves submission to God.



"Knowing" → "Doing" → "Being"
"The Mind" → "The Will" → "The Heart"
"Information" → "Application" → "Transformation"

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Applying the Bible - Explanation of the Tree Illustration:

Various references to vegetation can be found throughout the Bible.

The intent of the Tree Illustration is to show how application of the Bible can be seen in a diagram of a tree. There are two parts of the tree that can be seen (above the ground) and one part that normally cannot be seen (below the ground).

The top of the tree can be seen and it is our **heart**. Our heart is revealed to others when we react to adverse circumstances. Our heart is a reflection of who we really are. It is our "**being**". It is where **transformation** takes place and fruit is produced.

Prov 27:19 As water reflects a face, so a man's heart reflects the man. (NIV)Matt 6:21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (NIV)Matt 7:17 Likewise every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. (NIV)

The other part of the tree that can be seen is the trunk. The trunk is where the **mind** is and it is where **information** from the Bible resides. "**Knowing**" the Bible is an essential part of the tree and needed to produce good fruit.

Ps 119:105 Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path. (NIV) **Jer 15:16** When your words came, I ate them; they were my joy and my heart's delight, for I bear your name, O LORD God Almighty. (NIV)

The part of the tree that is not easy to see is the roots. The roots of the tree provide nourishment to the whole tree allowing it to grow and bear fruit in the heart. The root is where the **will** is and the place where **application** takes place. As a result, it is where "**doing**" resides.

Prov 2:1-5 My son, if you accept my words and store up my commands within you, turning your ear to wisdom and applying your heart to understanding, and if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding, and if you look for it as for silver and search for it as for hidden treasure, then you will understand the fear of the LORD and find the knowledge of God.(NIV
