Dear Friends,

I know, I just know, that I packed those things up when we moved from Tallahassee and that they are hiding in some squirrely place. But I am so peeved I can't see where they are in my mind's eye. 

meal, whether they are learning from home or at school. During this time, there is no paperwork, no registration, and no income verification required.


