Pastor's Study Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Feast of the Holy Family

Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

Three dreams of life saving messages! Three times in this reading, God tells Joseph how to save the Holy Family from being harmed/killed by Herod through dreams! Joseph, the foster father of Jesus, possesses the gift of dream interpretation just like his ancestor's namesake Joseph did also. His ancestor Joseph was the OT patriarch who had just as colorful an imagination as his many-colored coat was reported in Genesis 37:3. In todays' gospel we hear of Joseph being nudged by God through three different dreams (He had already been led once, in a dream to accept a pregnant Mary, in Matthew 1:20). In this reading, first, Joseph is called to flee Egypt, to escape Herod's murderous jealousy (Matt 2:13). Then secondly, after Herod's own death, God sends word through a dream to Joseph to head back toward their homeland of Judea (Matt 2:19-20). However, whether Joseph interpreted the dream wrong, or events on the ground changed, God adjusted the travel route by messaging in another dream (the third time's the charm) some advanced detail, instructing Joseph specifically, to move and settle home farther up north safely in Galilee (Matt 2:22). Joseph was sensitive enough to discern God's direction through the use of his personal dreams.

Dreams can figure large in the lives of people. We see it happen in Scripture. Some biblical figures who God spoke to, through dreams, include the patriarch Jacob (Gen 28:10-22) & the prophet Daniel (Dan 2:19, 7:1). But, God tries to break through to nonbelievers, too, using their dreams. Some examples of God speaking to non-believers include the case of King Nebuchadnezzar's dream in Daniel 2 & 4, or King Abimelech's dream in Genesis 20:3. A similar dream intervention occurs in the New Testament with Pontius Pilate's wife in Matthew 27:19.

Back the beginning of December, I was excited to hear about a book about to be published which contained a complete transcript of the interviews between Dr Carl Jung, a Depth Psychologist and his long-time editor Aniela Jaffé. The interviews were the source material for his memoir, titled "Memories, Dreams & Reflections". But this release is the entire transcript of their conversations! Like Joseph, Carl Jung was a master at interpreting the spiritual content of dreams. He encourages us to approach our dreams as potential sources of meaningful direction. He taught that we should wisely approach them as helpful guides in considering action or decisions in our lives (of course, with prudent counsel). Dreams are good material for further deliberation and discussion that can yield fulfilling resolutions to our life's events. A couple of past popular books taught the same idea. They include Morton Kelsey's (1977) "Dreams: A Way to Listen to God" & John Sanford's (1989) "Dreams: God's Forgotten Language." Some people keep dream journals, just as they do prayer journals. Many literary authors draw their great plots or characters from them! Something to pray about and consider!

Yet, also many saints have had their lives turned around, because of dreams! Biographical tradition holds that St. Patrick was guided by a dream to escape his enslavement and captivity (the dream called him to flee in the night to the coast where a ship happened to be in port waiting to sail to Britain!) After his conversion, he was also led by God in a dream to return to Ireland, freely though this time, to minster to the people as a Catholic missionary.

Also, before St. Dominic was born, his mother dreamed of a black and white dog carrying a burning torch. The Latin name for the Dominicans, who set the world on fire for God, is Domini-canes (Dogs of the Lord). Also the great youth minster, St. John Bosco dreamed once of fighting dogs that were transformed into lambs. He interpreted the dream as God's direction to him, to take up the important work of shepherding the abandoned youth (wild) on the streets, and helping them be changed by Christ into upright young men. There is an inspirational book of St John Bosco, that reports a collection of some of his dreams from God (out of many from his obvious 'dream-prayer journal'). It is titled "The Forty Dreams of St. John Bosco."

Accounts are told of certain scientists that 'got *inspiration*' for their scientific breakthroughs (paradigm shifts) from their dreams, such as James Watson's dream of what turned out to be the actual shape of the DNA's double-helix, or August Kekulé documenting the structure of the benzene ring, or Dmitri Mendeleev's dream that led him to systematize elements by their properties (such as their reactivity & atomic weight). So dreams are powerful!

And dreams are an important tool God used with St Joseph to protect the Blessed Mother and our Savior! And God *may* use them with us! We may want to think again and pray about that last dream we had that stuck with us after a good night's rest! St Joseph, pray for us! Peace, Fr brian
