Luke 14:1, 7-14



"On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully. He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

# Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C Luke 14:1, 7-14

"Humble yourself, or others will gladly do it for you." In this rough and tumble, prideful world of ours, no one stays on top long. If we happen to rise, yet lack a self-respecting humility, then inevitably, someone else will pull us down. So Jesus advises proactively lowering oneself, (one's estimation of oneself and one's actual standing), to prevent such a fall or career crash. In Luke 14:10, Jesus teaches, "when invited to a banquet, go and take the lowest place." One way of viewing this advice, is that, at least (?) from such a lowered position, one can only go up! Jesus says further, "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted" (Lk 14:11)

Jesus' parable about taking the lowest seat at the banquet, reminds me of another teaching story told by the Christian desert father Abba Theophilus. Theophilus tells about a young man who had followed various elders' advice to go do penance in order to find fulfillment. One elder told him to work as a ferryman, to courteously bear all offenses as due to him and give away his income to the poor, to attain wisdom. After several years working, the young man retired to move to Athens to study contemplation (Theoria). As he approached the city gate, a wise philosopher sitting there mocked and humiliated him, and the young man laughed back joyously! The philosopher acted surprised, and said, 'Why do you laugh, I put you down?" To which the seeker laughed more, "For three years I have paid to be insulted and now as a student of wisdom, here I am insulted free of charge!"

When we proudly fight back insults, or stew angrily over humiliations, we are further paying for it! Yet, when we honestly know ourselves, we can welcome such humbling (self-initiated or other-inflicted), because it is not on us- it is free (and we)! I see such an honest self-appraisal and humble focus on higher causes (God's work-Kingdom), when Jesus reprimanded James and John who sought to retaliate in anger after being insulted by a rejecting Samaritan town back in Luke 9:54-56. There, Jesus advised brushing (laughing) it off and keeping attention on the greater mission – there is too much good work to be done than to be dragged down by someone else's pettiness. Move on, not becoming hurt or entangled in pride's clawing back and forth.

Jesus continues His teaching about the Christian servant's humility by saying, "If you hold a banquet, invite the poor e poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind -- blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you" (Luke 14:13-14). For the disciple of Jesus, service work is not about payment. It is about goodness being shared. Goodness, holiness and virtue are their own reward. The Christian servant is good about hospitality and helping others, not for any recognition or reward, but for the sheer goodness of it. We can witness how goodness grows of itself through such humble, anonymous service directed solely to the benefit of other people. We see the contagious 'paying it forward' element, that does not stop for any return accolades but simply anonymously (humbly) continues forward with the free distribution of the grace cycle!

When Jesus sent out the apostles on mission, one of his commands to them was, "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give" (Matthew 10:8) And St Paul says it this way, "What do you possess that you have not received?" (1 Corinthians 4:7) The humble person knows that they depend upon God, and that all we have (if anything) is a gift from God. We must remember that what is here today can be gone tomorrow (Job 1:21 "The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away, yet blessed be the name of the LORD!"). So, Jesus calls His followers to not rely upon their own self-promotions or self-projections (I am reminded of the politician who was caught calling newspapers early in his career, acting like a publicist telling columnists to check out this outstanding, up-and-coming guy who turned out, because the call was taped, to be the shameless self-promoting guy himself'). St Paul says, "Romans 12:3 "I tell everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than one ought to think..."

Jesus calls us to trust in His care and always seek the lowest position among others. Isn't this just another way of simply saying, "Always put others ahead of yourself." Romans 12:10 has St Paul telling Christians to 'outdo one another in showing honor to the other." each other." But if we don't, count on a fall. "Whoever thinks he is standing secure should take care not to fall" (1 Corinthians 10:12). Peace and Prayers, Fr Brian
