


Romans Chapter 15

Burden bearing.


Wrap-up by verses:



For this reason I also have been much hindered from coming to you.

Wrap-up by verses:

□ Paul longs to visit Rome but must first journey to Jerusalem to deliver a relief offering to the poor there, vs. 14-22.

Study question:

Paul's guiding precept was, "I have reason to glory in Christ Jesus in the things which pertain to God." How did that help him to be a profitable servant?

□ Paul commends the Romans and attributes the boldness of his letter to his calling as Christ's ambassador. He has been about the business of trailblazing for the sake of Christ, *vs.* 23-29.

Study question:

Paul had a longing to visit Rome, but his trip there had to be postponed. What are some good things to keep in mind when it comes to the postponed fulfillment of deep longings?


