Absent: Will Mechnig, Student Representative.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Cole called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, followed by Vernon Yoder, Mont Ida Church of the Brethren, giving the invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES
