# Pacific Dawn May 21, 2011 By Christine Tureaud

On May 21<sup>st</sup> as usual Joel and Christine showed up early for a fishing trip on the Pacific Dawn.

Patiently awaiting the return of the boat we wanted to expedite time by putting our poles in the rack and save our bunks with the heavy bag containing the kitchen sink . Will and Denise followed approximately 30 minutes behind us. Others slowly trickled in. We hardly gave the crew enough time to clean before we dumped everything . Off to dinner at Milanos as usual . Will and Denise had a palate for fish and chips at another establishment. After

filling our stomachs we made our way back to the boat. It was like a ghost town, everyone else left the boat. Pat gave twenty two anglers safety regulations before departing and introduced the second ticket, Bill Cavanaugh his brother. Of course Jeremy, Mike and Shell were also introduced. We stopped at the bait receiver, picked up some anchovies that appeared to be uncured.

We arrived at a deep water fishing area which appeared to be a bonanza. The majority of the rock fish were very large

. Some of the reds spit out perch looking fish as they landed on the deck. So many rods were bent. Pat, Bill, Jeremy, and Mike were kept very busy just taking the fish off the hooks and untangling lines. We filled our quota of rock fish early.

Pat decided to try something different. We moved to another destination approximately two hours away, this gave the crew time to clean 220 rock fish. We started rigging up for Halibut.... Mostly everyone were using anchovies with either a number one or two hook.. The hook looked so tiny, who would catch anything with it? I had twenty pound pink Ande line, twenty pound seaguar flouro carbon leader with a 12 ounce sinker and a old sabre rod #195, 6'. Things were sort of slow at first, however, Will and Joel had legal ling cod in this area. Joel's ling weighted 7 lb.15 oz. The bait tank contained a live octopus the ling spit out. As I preceded to make my way to the bait tank for an anchovy, after four tries, my eye caught a glimpse of a 10 1b. sheephead . I decided that's what I was going to fish for. A piece of frozen squid, was ripped in half and the bait splashed into the water. After about five minutes a fish gobbled up the squid. I said to myself oh boy, a big sheephead! It started to peel line out from the bow to the stern. Then I said " my line is going to get caught on the squid lamp". Jeremy stayed at my side and assured me that I could bring in the fish without getting caught on the fixture. As I reeled the fish in, a big brown blob was coming toward the boat. At first I thought it was a seal. Water magnifies fish. It was a whopper. 39.7 lb. halibut to my surprise. Nice way to finish the day. Our appreciation goes to Brad Gardner the charter master and camera man including, Pete Branch, Bill Cavanaugh, and Denise Davis the camera lady.
