Earl J. Mausolf, 83, of Harbor Beach, passed away Tuesday, April 11, 2006, in the long term care unit of Harbor Beach Community Hospital. Born near Harbor Beach on July 13, 1922, he was the son of the late Benjamin and Christina (Essenmacher) Mausolf.
