Judge Robin D. Pittman, a native New Orleanian, has served as Judge for Orleans Parish Criminal District Court, Section F, since January of 2009. Judge Pittman graduated *cum laude* from Loyola University New Orleans where she received a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology in December 1991. In May 1996, Judge Pittman received a Juris Doctorate from Loyola University New Orleans School of Law.

Judge Pittman is a graduate of the Institute of Politics at Loyola University and she successfully completed the Louisiana Judicial Leadership Institute. She was appointed by the Louisiana Supreme Court to the Louisiana Judicial College Board of Governors and was also appointed by Loyola University, College of Law to the Board of Directors where she served as secretary.

Judge Pittman was a Democratic candidate for the Louisiana Fourth Circuit Court of Appeal in 2018. She ran in the special election on March 24, 2018, to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Judge Madeleine M. Landrieu.
