## PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT: FAIR HOUSING, IT'S THE LAW

To promote fair housing practices, City of Cisco encourages potential homeowners and renters to be aware of their rights under the National Fair Housing Law. Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, prohibits discrimination against any person on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, disability, familial status or national origin in the sale or rental of units in the housing market. ## POLICY OF NONDISCRIMINATION ON THE BASIS OF DISABILITY

## CITIZEN PARTICIPATION & GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES NOTICE FOR THE GLO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT-MIT MOD PROGRAM

City of Cisco has adopted complaint and grievance procedures regarding its Community Development Block Grant Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) RCP Program. Citizens may obtain a Copy of these written procedures from the Mayor, Stephen Forester at the City of Cisco City Hall located at 500 Conrad Hilton Blvd, Cisco, TX 76437, or by 254-442-2111, during regular business hours. These procedures outline the steps for a citizen to follow if he/she wishes to file a complaint or grievance about GLO CDBG-MIT MOD activities. A person who has a complaint or grievance about any services or activities with respect to the GLO CDBG-MIT MOD project may, during regular business hours, submit such complaint or grievance, in writing to Stephen Forester at the City of Cisco. City of Cisco will make every effort to respond fully to such complaints or grievances within fifteen (15) working days where practicable after receipt of the original complaint or grievance.
