Technological and Ecological Advances in the Management of Lakes and Ponds Without Chemicals

EPA-registered herbicides and algaecides are a safe and reliable solution for the management of algae and aquatic weeds in our community waterbodies, but this management route has its challenges. Permitting can be difficult in certain regions, and some communities may ultimately prefer to take a more natural approach. Luckily, there are many sustainable ways to manage the health, beauty and longevity of your community's fresh-water resources — without reliance on herbicides or algaecides. A proactive management approach will help maintain the environmental balance throughout the entire aquatic ecosystem and ensure potential problems are addressed before they have a significant impact on your property or your wallet.

Directions

From the West - LIE east to Exit 49N/Route 110 North to Huntington. After exiting the LIE onto Route 110, cross over the LIE (clover leaf) and travel just less than a 1/2 mile before making a right into the Fairfield Corporate Plaza parking lot. The main entrance is located on the south-west side of the building and may be entered from the southern parking lot.

From the East - LIE west to Exit 49N/Route 110 North to Huntington. After exiting the LIE, proceed along the North Service Road and make a right onto Route 110. Travel just less than a 1/2 mile before making a right into the Fairfield Corporate Plaza parking lot. The main entrance is located on the southwest side of the building and may be entered from the southern parking lot.
