EXECUTIVE SESSION

At approximately 7:36 p.m., Mr. Piazza moved and Ms. O'Connor seconded to adopt Resolution #15-26, to enter into an executive session to discuss a contract matter. All in favor, motion carried.

At 8:14 p.m., Mr. Piazza moved and Ms. O'Connor seconded to return to open session. All in favor, motion carried.

CFO'S REPORT

As discussed last month, the escrow account at the Bank of America has been closed and funds returned to the sub-account holders.

The Authority's cash position as of April 30, 2015 is approximately \$6,000,000. Mr. Olshefski said there are some potential investment opportunities, such as a Money Market or CD, which would yield a higher interest rate. He suggested moving \$2.5 - \$3 million dollars into one of these accounts.

He did not see any issues with the budget and explained the revenue and expenditure summaries in more detail.

If approved tonight, a procedure is in place regarding liquidated damages. Mr. Tipton will prepare a letter on the amount of liquidated damages, and the letter will be attached to Tomar's invoice. The amount will be deducted from their payment request and will be held in a reserve account.

Mr. Olshefski left the meeting.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Mr. Tipton's comments were covered in executive session and he had nothing further to report.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Donati's report was distributed in the agenda packets.

CP Engineers had nominated the Oxford WWTP Upgrade Project for the New Jersey Alliance for Action Distinguished Engineering Award. The Authority won and Mr. Donati presented the award to the MUA.

Oxford WWTF ACO: CPE met with the DEP and toured the Oxford Upgrade project. The DEP expressed dissatisfaction with the contractor's progress and requested more information regarding their winter weather delay claim.

Oxford Upgrade: Tomar's payment request #16, for \$503,930.70, has been submitted and CPE recommended it for payment.

There are a number of value added work directives. Mr. Donati distributed a chart describing these work directives and their cost and schedule implications. He explained the work related contract time extension requests in more detail. Tomar has requested a total extension of 66 days but, based on careful analysis, CPE is recommending 12.75 days.

Tomar's latest progress schedule shows late July as their completion date, but CPE does not believe this is realistic based on number of workers Tomar has on the project. This issue has been mentioned to Tomar at every progress meeting.

The Substantial Completion date was March 25, and with the work directive days previously discussed, it would bring the Substantial Completion date to April 7, 2015.

Warren Haven Pump Station Rehab: Action on this project was halted because it became more than just a pump replacement job. The system is undersized and the wet well needs to be increased. CPE provided Mr. Wauhop with a memo that updates the scope of the project. It will now require a TWA application and Highlands exemption, as well as additional engineering. An estimated cost to do both pump stations is now almost \$450,000. Mr. Rosenberg initiated discussion about the cost involved for improving the pump station that serves only the Warren Haven Nursing Home and a few other county-owned buildings. He wondered if the new owner of the nursing home (a privately owned company) should not be contributing to the cost of this improvement, rather than the ratepayers being burdened by this portion of the project. There was further discussion on the matter, as well as future billing ideas for sewage treatment charges.

AUTHORITY CONSULTANT

Mr. Wauhop distributed his report prior to the meeting.

Belvidere plant: He recapped maintenance items performed during the month. In the blower room, the concrete pad that was saw cut last month was repaired. The Pro2 Water Soluble Oxygen test equipment was set up on May 6th and 7th.

Oxford plant: He recapped maintenance items performed during the month. They found the manhole located in White Township for the A&P line. White Township will be installing a meter for that line.

Under general business, testing of the process that utilizes the Pro2 Water Soluble Oxygen equipment has begun. Since then, fewer loads of sludge have been transported for disposal, decanting is quicker, and there is more control over wasting. The two-week trial period is over and Mr. Wauhoh is optimistic but suggested testing for another four weeks. He has negotiated a deal with the company who provided the equipment, whereby they will let us keep the equipment for the additional time and only charge us the operating costs for the savings realized by not having to truck out the sludge. Therefore, the Authority's net operating costs would be the same, no additional costs.

Mr. Wauhoh has been in discussions with one of the commissioners at PCFA about this process. A test has been tentatively set up for June 1, for PCFA to bring two truckloads of raw leachate to the Belvidere plant. Mr. Donati recommended multiple months of testing before making a final decision.

Regarding the bill discussed at the last meeting from Bill Hodge Electrical, Mr. Wauhoh stated the bill was not for JCP&L. It was related to our generator's frozen diesel fuel line.

FINANCE (TREASURER)

Mr. Piazza stated the bills have been reviewed.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #15-27 (Certificate No. 346: \$62,292.44) be approved to pay all bills from the Operating Fund. Mr. Niece seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Rosenberg received additional information on supplemental health insurance for a retiree, which was distributed to the commissioners. More information is needed from the retiree, past minutes and personnel policy language; Ms. Kaspereen was directed by the Board to obtain that information. Mr. Wauhoh offered to contact Mr. Olshefski on the matter. There was further discussion on the matter, and some suggestions about giving the retiree a monthly stipend so that he could chose his own supplemental insurance. Mr. Tipton stated that it would be more appropriate to discuss this under execution session next month, once he has reviewed the past minutes and policy language before he gives an opinion, if any.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #15-28 (Certificate No. 354: \$532,590.55) be approved to pay all bills from the Capital Improvements Fund, with the caveat that 23 days, at \$1,500 per day, for a total of \$34,500 be deducted from Tomar's invoice as liquidated damages. Mr. Rosenberg

After a brief discussion, it was decided that Mr. Niece would pass along Mr. Wauhop's contact information.

There was no public present.

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Mr. Niece moved and Ms. O'Connor seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 9:12 p.m.
