# Tidings of Hope

#### pastor's letter

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Welcome to 40 days of repentance that we call Lent. Lent comes from the word "lengthen," for the lengthening of days. The number 40 is the Biblical number for preparation, testing and punishment. And so it is appropriate that we begin Lent with the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday as a sign of turning back to God.

For example, God washed the earth clean of sin in 40 days and 40 nights, saving only Noah and his family. Jonah preached to Nineveh that in 40 days the city would be destroyed if they did not turn from their wicked ways. The Hebrew children wandered 40 years in the wilderness. Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness after His baptism being tested by Satan. A generation is considered to be about 40 years.

As we consider the trust given us of passing on the Gospel as Jesus commanded in Matthew 28:19, "Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. And 'don't forget', I am with you to the close of the age." As we consider this command, we also delight in the promise that He is with us, even through pestilence and political unrest. It is up to us to pass this assurance on to the next generation. Please say an extra prayer for our students and their families.

March 14, at 11:00, is confirmation Sunday and we have 12 confirmands. Please keep these students and their families in your prayers. Since March 14 is also communion Sunday, we will have two services. I am hoping only confirmand's family will attend the later service, and the rest of us will be at the **9:30 service**, in order to safely observe the recommended guidelines to prevent the spread of disease.

The Tenth graders will **meet on Wednesday, March 10, at 7:30PM, after Lenten Services** for their last lesson in the fellowship hall (*please bring your Bibles and read the book of Jude, only 1 chapter in preparation.*) Students will get their robes and stoles set aside. Parents' help would be appreciated. Please call Pastor Jane (218-820-2017) to 'volunteer'. Please wear masks, and observe 6-foot distancing.

The First Communion students have been studying the 23rd Psalm and the Words of Institution from Part Five of Luther's Small Catechism. They will have a foot washing ceremony on March 16 and will bake unleavened bread to serve communion to their families on Maundy Thursday.

Holy Week will be observed with services on April 1 and 2, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, respectively at 6:30PM. No delicious Lenten soup and sandwiches will be served this year by our youth and their parents. We pray it will happen next year.

Please continue to pray for our nation, our state, our community and our church. There is great power in your prayers. **James 5:16:** *The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.* We are the righteous...when we are forgiven.

I thank you for **your prayerful support**, as your pastor, and I ask you to prayerfully support our church office manager as she retires with her husband. Please pray that we find God's own choice to fill these shoes. Let us give thanks for 19 years of faithfulness. This is a job that not only requires technical skill, but people skills, as well as a faithful heart for the mission of the church, and we thank God for Sylvia and what she has done for many of our children, teaching 6<sup>th</sup> grade Friday School, helping at Ignite, and many other loving tasks that usually go unnoticed, or without thanks.

In **Matthew 6:4-6**, Jesus explains that when we do things for Him that are unnoticed, He will reward us openly in heaven. I am sure we will see this in many who serve our church, on Council, teaching, in committees and on staff. Let us never forget that as the song from the first Sunday in Lent goes, "Jesus Sees" us, even if no one else does.
