

Everything you need to know before you sign up for this workshop.

1) SO, WHAT'S THIS WORKSHOP ALL ABOUT? How does it work and what does it offer?

On the first day the kids will be asked to sing a one minute song for the auditions. We then take them through some acting exercises where they get to perform commercials with their fellow cast members. We then cast the show; pass out their scripts and music. The second day of class we start putting their show together! This workshop rehearsal dates are Monday's Wednesday's and Friday's for two weeks - November 28, 30, December 5, 7, 9, 12, 14, 16. Rehearsals are from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. PERFORMANCE DATES AND TIMES: Sunday, December 18 at 6:00 p.m. / Monday and Tuesday December 19 and 20 at 5:00 and 7:00 p.m. both days. Tickets to see the show are \$8.00 per person. Everyone who registers gets a speaking role in the show. Kids ages 7 to 15 encouraged to enroll.

2) COVID and FLU SEASON PROTOCOLS

Only the kids in the workshop will be allowed in the theater during the rehearsal process. However, Mom and Dad may walk them to the check in table located outside the theater to sign them in. MASKING: We are now following the school districts protocols - we are no longer requiring the kids to wear masks - we recommend it, but we are not requiring it. Because it is being predicted that the flu season may be a bad one, we disinfect the the theater chairs and restrooms piror to each rehearsal and performance.

3) HOW DO I REGISTER and WHAT IS THE COST FOR ENROLLMENT?
