Changes Coming to Berkman



The City Transportation Department is planning to do some major work to Berkman Drive between 290 and 51st St. Certain stretches will receive left turn lanes (i.e., chicken lanes), while others will get extra-wide, fortified bike lanes. We can also expect more pedestrian islands/medians like what we have on Berkman here in our neighborhood in front of the high school stadium. Changes Coming to Local Bus Routes



CapMetro has unveiled what it is calling "*the biggest change to bus routing in 30 years.*" Routes 7, 37, and 320 all currently service our neighborhood and will be affected. Gas Line Street Construction Project



The partition of Coronado Hills Drive as well as the blockades of Glenhill Rd. and Barcelona Dr. was put in place the weekend of September 23–24. While many neighbors may have received the Notice of Work distributed by Texas Gas midweek before the closure, the notice lacked the full disclose of how our neighborhood would be affected. David Risher called and talked with the Texas Gas Service project manager, Robert Taber, on September 19. He indicated that the portion of the project affecting our neighborhood may not be completed until the end of November although he could not give me a more definitive timeline. That also means we will see the current partition and closures until the work through Berkman Drive is completed. David expressed our neighbor-



hood's displeasure on the lack of timely communication prior to the start of the project. Mr. Tabor apologized but indicated that the delay in permit approval by the City condensed their available project days to complete the project prior to the coldest winter days. David also called Councilmember Ora Houston's office and discussed the issue of the short communication notice to the neighborhood with one of her assistants. She indicated that she would communicate our concerns to Ms. Houston.
