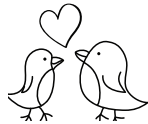

June 4 Henry Ford completed his first car, The Quadricycle

June 13, 1928 first Plymouth car was introduced. Chrysler's first entry in the low price field competing with Ford & Chevy; origins trace back to the Maxwell. Walter P. Chrysler took over the troubled Maxwell Chalmers In the early 20's and later use the facilities to build the car. By 1930, Plymouth was sold by all three Chrysler divisions: Chrysler – Dodge – Desoto. The Plymouth name came from the Plymouth Binder Twine even though the logo shows the Mayflower ship which landed at Plymouth Rock – production discontinued June 29th 2001.

June 27, 1973 Cadillac assembled its 5,000,000th car – a blue sedan deVille.

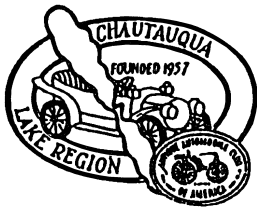
June 30, 1953 Chevy Corvette begins production in Flint, Michigan

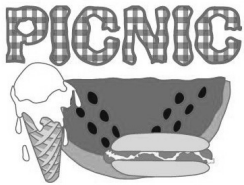

RULES OF THE ROAD FOR TOURING

National AACA rules to be followed by everyone

Expect anything! Anticipate everything!

Hopefully, the routes you've selected will take you away from mainstream traffic. Sometimes, however, even getting to those back roads can present a challenge.

Before the tour every member should fill his tank up with fuel. No fueling stops should be on the tour.

Driver's meeting - at time of tour -

Printed directions for all drivers. Tour chairman's cell phone # should be on directions.

Keep a reasonable distance between vehicles. (you have directions)

Keep up a reasonable speed (At the driver's meeting inform them of the speed you will be going).

Will obey all traffic rules and regulations.

Keep an eye on the person behind you.

If you do pull over use the simple THUMBS UP or THUMBS DOWN. So as the tour can continue.

Thumbs down the vehicle behind you should stop.

Tour routes should include some pauses, such as stopping points for sightseeing.
