Whatever happened to Connie Converse, a trailblazing songwriter, composer, and performer who disappeared in 1974 but left behind a legacy of music that was rediscovered in the early 2000's?

Howard Fishman, author musician, and writer (*The New Yorker, The New York Times, Rolling Stone*) explores her life, disappearance, and influence on music past and present.

Tapping into a large archive of Converse's left-behind materials, Fishman's presentation includes recordings of her music, photographs from her life, readings from her letters, and short excerpts from his acclaimed book.

Nexus: A Brief History of Information Networks from the Stone Age to Al by Yuval Noah Harari








