The stories that we read can often change our perspective of our day-to-day lives. Whenever you hear about a professional baseball player who decides to become a Catholic priest, this is one of those types of stories! The Book of the Month for both July and August 2025 is A Grand Slam for God: A Journey from Baseball Star to Catholic Priest by Fr Burke Masters. Father Burke Masters is now a Catholic priest in Illinois, but his life story has lots of ups and downs, including his conversion to the Catholic faith as well as the struggle of hearing God's call to become a Catholic priest. When we take the time to enter into some else's story and testimony of their encounter with Christ and journey of discipleship, it can change us and allow us to more fully follow Jesus in our lives as well. 

The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children

In the Gospel today, Jesus is tested by a scholar of the law. The scholar asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life and, prompted by Jesus, answers his own question: to love God with all our heart and to love our neighbor as ourselves. The scholar wants to know who his neighbor is. Jesus answers with a parable, the story of the Good Sarmatian. The Samaritan and Jews of Jesus' time did not get along.

A man is robbed and beaten nearly to death. A priest crosses the road to avoid the man. A Levite also walks by on the opposite side of the road.

Who finally stops to help?

A Samaritan stops to help the man. He risked his own safety to help the man in need. He spends both his time and his money to care for the man.

We might be used to helping our neighbors at church, in our neighborhood or in our family. But Jesus also wants us to help those we don't get along with and those we do not know.

How can you help the sick, those who are hungry, and those who are in need of clothing?



Jesus teaches us to treat all people with kindness and love. When we love others, we show our love for God.

Do not pass by someone in need:
For you may be the hand of God to them.

please contact Father Ben to discuss any interest you may have and to begin a conversation about what this could look like for our parish!"




The next potluck will be Sunday, July 20th following the 11am Mass.


