

THINGS TO DO THIS YEAR:

- 1. Go on a Journey there are 3 Journeys to choose from
 - a. Agent of Change
 - b. Get Moving
 - c. aMuse
- 2. Earn Badges check out the new badges available. Earn some of them as part of your Journey.
- 3. Earn Awards Junior Aid Award, Junior Leadership Pin, etc.
- 4. Go for the Bronze If you're a 5th grade Junior troop and have completed a Journey, it's
- 5. time to work on your Bronze Project. This will need to be completed prior to the Award Ceremony.
- 6. Pitch a Tent Junior girls love to camp. If you, or your co-leader, have completed all 3 phases of camping training, get out and camp. One or two night stays are great for the girls. Many camps/campsites offer activities that can be applied to badges.
- 7. Participate in a Council Event Our local council puts on events all the time. The only thing you need to do is register your troop and show up. They do all the work and your girls have a great time. It's also a great way for your scouts to meet other scouts. Go to the www.girlscoutsla.org website "Activities and Events" tab to find out more.
- 8. Run a Service Unit Event 4th and 5th grade girls are ready to put their skills into action. Each Service Unit event has an instruction book that tells you what you need to do to run the event. Remember, if no one steps up to run an event, it won't happen. Check with the event coordinator to see if any of these level-appropriate events are still available: Brownie Fun Day, Brownie Fly-Up, Daisy Bridging, Daisy Fun Day, Father/Daughter Dance, Girl Scout Sunday, Glenola Tree Lighting, Thinking Day-International Tasting Bee, Santa's Workshop for Brownies.
