Nick also built this cute bench that sits in front of the house.



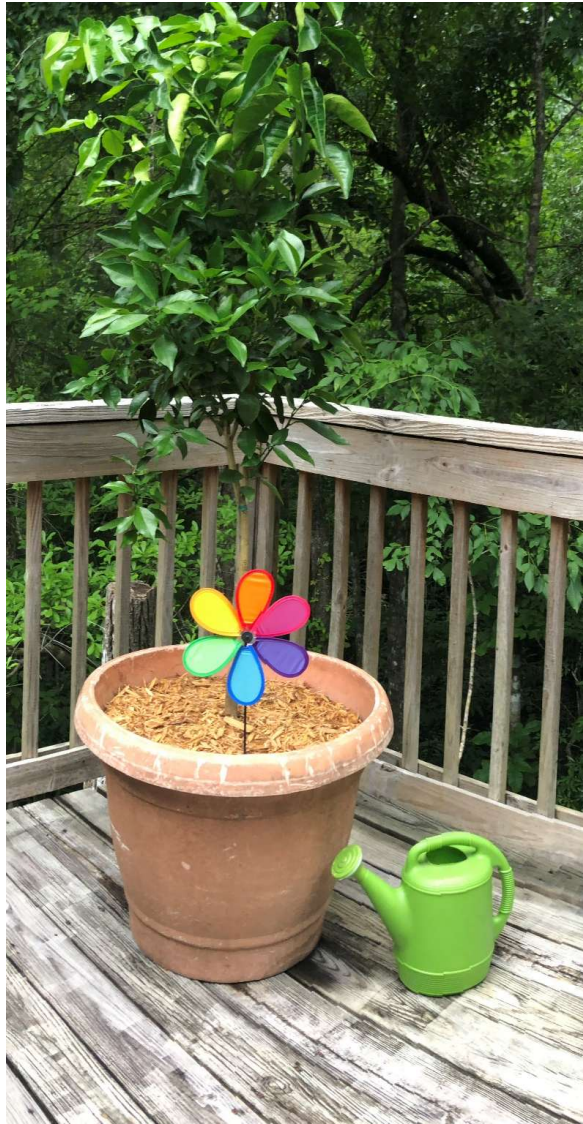
We built a stand for the Gheenoe that we are keeping on the creek where Nick and Carley are going to build.
