### **ATA Celebrates Dedication of Lucy Diggs Slowe Way**

Founder of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Lucy Diggs Slowe was celebrated with a dedication of a campus street renamed in her honor on the camps of Howard University, October 22, 2021. She was a Social Work student at Howard University and later, worked there. She was the first female Dean. Besides being an academic, Lucy was a participant in several sports including tennis and was an activist for females and people of color.

Little Known Fact: Lucy Diggs Slowe graduated from high school at the age of 21 because of her activism.

American Tennis Association (ATA) President Roxanne Aaron was on hand to add the ATA's accolades for Dean Slowe as she was the singles winner of the First ATA National Championship in 1917 held in Druid Park in Baltimore, Maryland. Dean Slowe went on to win a number of other ATA championships. Tennis players and ATA Life Members were also on hand for the ceremony while Walter Moore of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania participated with the assistance of his daughter via Face Time.

Activist, academic, sports person did it "her way" and is now remembered by the naming of Lucy Diggs Slowe Way, at the corner of Howard and 4<sup>th</sup> Street NW on the campus of Howard University.
