

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. How do I purchase a ticket for the garden tour?

- At ALL GARDENS, while tickets last, on tour day. Tickets are limited!

Children under 12 are admitted free, with accompanying paid adult(s).

2. Are tickets limited?

YES! There are a limited number of tickets available, and we have sold out in the past.

3. Is the tour accessible for those with mobility issues?

The tour gardens are on private, residential properties which may not be handicap accessible. Walkers, wheelchairs, and motorized mobility scooters (Rascals, etc.) are not advised. Many of the garden paths may be uneven and difficult to maneuver even with mobility devices. Some gardens may have stairs, slopes, or other obstacles. Individuals need to determine for themselves if the garden is accessible for them. The health and safety of our attendees, sponsors, vendors, volunteers, and homeowners is paramount. Please wear appropriate footwear and watch your step!

4. Are the gardens on the Garden Tour handicap accessible?

Generally, no. Each garden is unique, on private property, and may not be handicap accessible. Assisted mobility devices are not recommended. Many of the gardens include uneven steps, slopes, and other obstacles. The health and safety of our attendees, sponsors, vendors, volunteers, and homeowners is paramount. Please wear appropriate footwear and watch your step!

5. Can I bring my children?

Absolutely! Children are welcomed with a supervising adult. Please, no strollers or bicycles. Children under 12 are admitted free, with accompanying paid adult(s).

6. Can I bring my dog?

No pets are allowed in any of the gardens.

7. Can I get a refund?

There are no refunds for the garden tour ticket purchase, including for inclement weather. Give your ticket to a friend!

8. Can't attend?

Give your ticket to a friend! There are no refunds for the garden tour ticket purchase, including for inclement weather.

9. What if it rains on Garden Tour day?

The garden tour will proceed, rain or shine!

10. How many gardens will be featured on the Tour?

There will be 6 gardens on the Tour of all types and sizes. They span from one (1) in Coeur d'Alene, to one (1) in Hayden, to one (1) in Dalton Gardens, two (2) in Rathdrum, and one (1) in Athol. Something for everyone!

11. What is the Tour route?

This is a self-guided tour. Guests may begin and end at any garden they choose. **Please note, we do not make public the list of gardens until the week before the tour.** Garden addresses and maps are printed inside each ticket. A link to the garden addresses is included in each online ticket purchase confirmation and will be posted a day or two before the tour on our website and Facebook pages.

12. Will there be Vendors located at any of the gardens?

YES, There will be artisan, educational, and food vendors located at several of the gardens this year!
