



Each stanza here pairs an invitation from Jesus with a response from the narrator. These three invitations recall how Jesus welcomed those who were heavy laden (Matthew 11:28), offered living water (John 4:10–14), and identified himself as the light of the world (John 8:12, 9:5).

First Scripture Reading

- ¹ Save me, O God,
 - for the waters have come up to my neck.
- ² I sink in the miry depths, where there is no foothold.
- I have come into the deep waters;

the floods engulf me.

- ³ I am worn out calling for help; my throat is parched. My eyes fail, looking for my God.
- ⁴ Those who hate me without reason outnumber the hairs of my head; many are my enemies without cause, those who seek to destroy me.

I am forced to restore what I did not steal.

- ⁵ You, God, know my folly; my guilt is not hidden from you.
- ⁶ Lord, the Lord Almighty, may those who hope in you not be disgraced because of me;

God of Israel,

may those who seek you not be put to shame because of me.

- ⁷ For I endure scorn for your sake, and shame covers my face.
- ⁸ I am a foreigner to my own family, a stranger to my own mother's children;
- ⁹ for zeal for your house consumes me, and the insults of those who insult you fall on me.
- ¹⁰ When I weep and fast, I must endure scorn:
- ¹¹ when I put on sackcloth, people make sport of me.
- ¹² Those who sit at the gate mock me, and I am the song of the drunkards.

But I pray to you, Lord,in the time of your favor;in your great love, O God,answer me with your sure salvation.

Rescue me from the mire,do not let me sink;deliver me from those who hate me,from the deep waters.

or the depths swallow me up or the pit close its mouth over me.

- ¹⁷ Do not hide your face from your servant; answer me quickly, for I am in trouble.
