1 Hazleton Art League

Address: 225 E. Broad St., Hazleton, PA 18201. Phone: (570) 454-0092. Parking is available nearby, behind the Knights of Columbus building on the corner of Broad and Poplar. The building is handicap accessible.

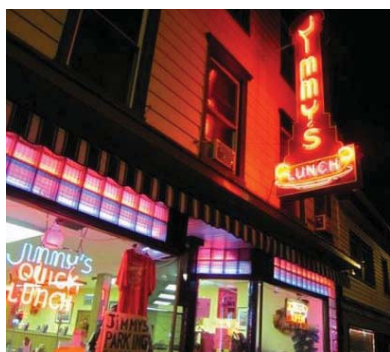

2 Greenleaf Gallery & Gift Shop

The Greenleaf Gallery & Gift Shop is an independent 4000 square foot fine arts gallery located 8 minutes from downtown Hazleton on Rte. 93 in the old St. Mary's Church in Beaver Meadows. In addition to their extensive art collection the Greenleaf Gallery will be hosting artist Brianne (Penny) Lane.

4 The Dominican House Artists

The Dominican House will be singing the first Christmas carols (Aguinaldos) of the season as they practice for the upcoming holidays. Stop by to enjoy the sound of traditional instruments, and taste arepa (corn pancakes) and hot chocolate. Founded in 2005, The Dominican House of Hazleton is a non-profit institution dedicated to helping the Hispanic Community with citizenship, computer literacy, and English (ESL) training, and promoting the Hispanic culture in Hazleton and surrounding areas through children's programs (art and music) and various other cultural and folkloric workshops for children and adults.



5 The Poppy Press Coffee Company

Address: 9 E. Broad St, Hazleton, PA 18201. Phone: 570-401-9791. Parking is available on Broad Street in front of the building. Meters are .25/15 minutes. The Pango parking app option is available for smartphones. Meters are free after 6PM. This building is handicap accessible.

The Poppy Press is downtown Hazleton's newest cafe and coffee shop. Owner Tamara Hersberger is excited to be hosting artists Mike Segilia and Christie Welch.

Mike Segilia works mostly with watercolors and sometimes acrylics. He loves painting seascapes, landscapes and portraits. **Christie Welch** creates what she considers to be salvage art. She uses repurposed frames from thrift stores, as well as scrap aluminum as the sign base. She uses old license plates and other scrap items to create one of a kind pieces.



6 The Creative Voltage Mural

Address: Located to the rear of Hazle Drugs (7 N. Wyoming Street), Hazleton, PA 18201. Parking is available on site.

The Creative Voltage Mural was completed in 2017 by Boston artist and Hazleton native Mary Veronica Sweeney with support from the Downtown Hazleton Alliance for Progress and the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts. The mural depicts Thomas Edison, who in 1883 made Hazleton the third city in the world to have 2-wire, 3 phase streetlights. Edison, together with the miners who extracted the coal to make electrification possible, helped make the City of Hazleton a center for business and culture well into the 20th-century. In this mural Edison transfers his creative energy to the children of the community.

Or if Italian food is more your taste visit Frankie's Pizzeria, locally owned & operated by the Vito family for more than 20 years!





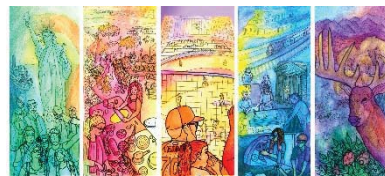

OPEN HOUSE: Hazleton LaunchBox

Public parking is also available on Broad Street in front of the building. Meters are .25/15 minutes or use Pango parking app. Meters are free after 6PM. This building is handicap accessible.

The Hazleton LaunchBox, supported by Pasco L. Schiavo Esq. is a no-cost business accelerator and co-working space designed to provide early-stage startup companies with the support and resources needed to build a sustainable business and a viable plan for growth. It is open to community members, and those affiliated with Penn State. The public is invited to tour the facility to see one of the newest additions to the Arts & Innovation District in downtown Hazleton.

Featured during the Greater Hazleton Art Trail are works created by art students and projects designed by students in a wide range of classes and printed with a 3-dimensional printer.

Mary Veronica Sweeney, affectionately known as "MV," enjoys teaching traditional art practices while directing multiple public art projects, such as, the five-banner, full-colored "Hazleton Way" mural to be installed on the new Hayden Family Arts Center. The public is invited to stop in and view samples of Sweeney's work, as well as contribute a few brush strokes to the Hazleton Way mural, currently in progress.

MV is a Hazleton native and teaching artist passionista. She earned a MFA from the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts in Philadelphia, a MA in Filmmaking studying with painter/director David Lynch, and an Ed.M from the Harvard Graduate School of Education researching the arts, technology and innovation in learning. Sweeney is an adjunct professor of art at Luzerne County Community College where she has taught mural arts and foundation courses in studio painting.

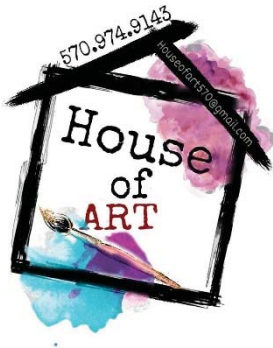

The Together We Can Mural was completed by artist Jason Braun in partnership with Communities That Care (CTC) Youth Outreach Members in 2017. The story behind the mural begins with the Carrier Pigeon; a bird that represents the message of unity through hard work. Peace is depicted by the Dove with the olive branch. The unity theme is further strengthened by the diverse group of people working together to build our community.



16 Student-Led Murals of HIP (at the Hazleton One Community Center)

The Hazleton One Community Center is home to The Hazleton Integration Project, a community-based effort that seeks to unite the people of many different cultures who call Hazleton home. The project is the brainchild of Hazleton native and California Angels Manager, Joe Maddon. Since 2017, the Center has added seven murals. Four were painted by K-8 students with the help of artist-in-residence, Deb Telatovich, and one each by local artists Mary Veronica Sweeney, Mariluz Rodriquez, Isabel Colon, and Gigi Perez. 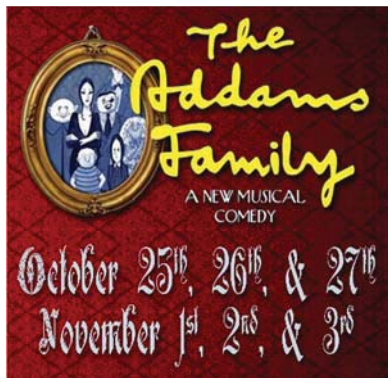

Creamery Hours: Friday: 4:00 -11:00 PM and Saturday: 1:00 PM-11:00 PM.

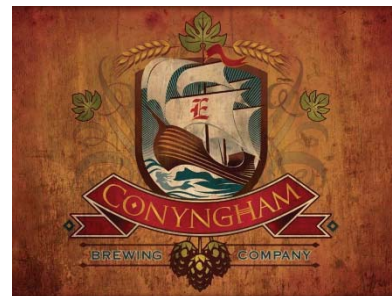
