



²Wash me through and through from my wickedness, and cleanse me from my sin. ³For I know my offenses, and my sin is ever before me.


⁴Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are justified when you speak and right in your judgment.

Silence for self-reflection.


God of mercy and forgiveness,




