Daniel Breen Lecturer, Legal Studies Program Brandeis University

Daniel Breen is a lecturer in the legal studies program at Brandeis. He has been teaching at Brandeis since 1998, and one of his courses is Louis Brandeis: Law, Business and Politics. He also teaches The Legal Boundaries of Public and Private Life, Civil Liberties in America, Business Law and Science on Trial.


He received his BA from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, his MA and JD from the University of Georgia and his PhD from Boston College.

Professor Breen was a member of the "LBD 100" committee, which was comprised of faculty and staff from various departments across campus who worked to plan the celebrations commemorating the centennial of Louis Brandeis' nomination and confirmation to the U.S. Supreme Court

He received the Louis D. Brandeis Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2017.

Last year was the 50th anniversary of *In the Matter of Gault*, by which the Supreme Court extended meaningful due process rights to minor children accused of crimes. That case happened to stem from events that took place 90 miles from Phoenix, in the town of Globe, AZ. No one could ever have thought that those events would give rise to one of the most important cases of the 20th century. This complex case can be summarized as the intersection of jurisprudence, common sense and fortunate timing, which reshaped juvenile justice.



- An internationally known journalist and author, Matti grew up in Toronto and emigrated to Israel at age 18.
- ▼ As a reporter and editor for the Jerusalem bureau of the Associated Press, assignments took him to Egypt, Morocco, Lebanon, Moscow and Washington, D.C.
- ▼ His op-ed pieces have appeared in the Wall Street Journal, the New York Times and The Atlantic.
- ▼ His first book, The Aleppo Codex (2014), was translated into seven languages. It won the Sami Rohr Prize, the ALA Sophie Brody Medal and the Canadian Award in History.
- ▼ Pumpkinflowers: A Soldier's Story (2016) was selected as a New York Times Notable Book.
- ▼ Pumpkinflowers was also chosen as one of the best books of 2016 by Amazon, Booklist, Mother Jones, Foreign Policy, the National Post and the Globe and Mail.
- ▼ His new book (March, 2019), a true--life thriller about a small group of men who became Israel's first spies, was the winner of the Jewish Book Council's 2018 Natan Book Award.




- ▼ This internationally bestselling author studied history and literature at Harvard.
- ▼ After graduation, he spent five years at *The Atlantic* reporting on crime, private military contractors, terrorism prosecutions and international gangs.
- ▼ His first novel, *The 500* (2012), was translated into 20 languages, became an international bestseller and was optioned for a movie.
- ▼ The 500 was also nominated for the Edgar Award and won the International Thriller Writers' and Strand Critics Awards for best first novel.
- Best-selling thrillers followed, including *The Directive* (2014), *Cold Barrel Zero* (2016) and *Dead Man Switch* (2017).
- ▼ "Sophisticated storytelling," "whiplash pacing," "authentic and fully fleshed characters," "meticulous research" and "all-too-real threats" are characteristics of his books.
- ▼ His new book (January, 2019) is the story of a Russian mole in the White House and the FBI agent "who must question everything and trust no one" to stop the threat.

- Marie is a magna cum laude graduate of Boston College and a cum laude graduate of Boston University School of Law.
- ▼ She spent ten years as a litigator for two of the country's top law firms before turning to writing.
- ▼ As Heather Terrell, she wrote the popular historical novels *Chrysalis* (2007), *The Map Thief* (2009), *Brigid of Kildare* (2010) and the young adult series, the *Books of Eva* (2010).
- ▼ Under a pen name, she wrote novels about real women whose contributions had been overlooked.
- ▼ These historical novels were international bestsellers: *The Other Einstein* (2016) and *Carnegie's Maid* (2018) both LibraryReads Picks.

Karen Sinclair, Violinist

Karen Sinclair enjoys an active performance career as an orchestral and chamber musician. She holds degrees from the Curtis Institute of Music, Royal Academy of Music in London and Rice University. A native of West Chester, Pennsylvania, she has been a member of the Phoenix Symphony's first violin section since 2008.

Karen made her solo debut with the Philadelphia Orchestra when she was eleven years old. Major awards include top prizes at the Tibor Varga International Violin Competition in Switzerland and the International Competition of Padua, Italy. She was featured on Phoenix's Downtown Chamber Series and performed with the Mill Ave Chamber Players and Fountain Hills Chamber Players. Karen has performed as a substitute with the Philadelphia Orchestra, The Philharmonia Orchestra (London), Houston Symphony and Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra. During the 2017-18 season, she appeared as a soloist with the Phoenix Symphony.

Christopher McKay, Violist

Christopher McKay joined The Phoenix Symphony in 2008 and is currently Acting Assistant Principal Viola. He has performed with the Grant Park Orchestra in Chicago, the Central City Opera in Colorado, the Louisville Orchestra, Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra, Owensboro Symphony, New Jersey Opera, Baton Rouge Symphony Orchestra and the Lancaster Festival Orchestra.

Mr. McKay's career also includes chamber musician, soloist, and teacher. He was with the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra and the University of Evansville, including a residency with the Eykamp String Quartet. While there, he was a soloist in Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's *Sinfonia Concertante for Violin and Viola* and performed the part of Sancho Panza in Richard Strauss' *Don Quixote* in 2006.

He received degrees from Louisiana State University (BM) and Indiana University (MM), and has twice been a fellow at the Tanglewood Arts Center.





Olga Gorelik, Pianist

Belorussian-born pianist Olga Gorelik maintains an active career as a solo and chamber musician while serving as a devoted mentor to her students. Chamber music has been a significant part of Ms. Gorelik's education and performance career. As a member of the Klimt trio, she took a Silver medal at the 2007 Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition, as well as the Alice Coleman/Coleman Barstow Prize at the Coleman Chamber Ensemble Competition. Since graduating cum laude from the Cleveland Institute of Music, her career highlights include a series of collaborative recitals throughout the US and the UK, including appearances in Chicago, Cleveland, Edinburgh, St. Andrew's and London. Ms. Gorelik, having recently relocated to Phoenix, continues her mission to contribute to the culture of her new home as a performer, an educator and an advocate for the tradition of the art.

As usual, the MOB will gather at Milk and Honey, the restaurant inside the J, at noon for a nosh.



Holocaust Survivor Rena Finder: It is happening again, today.

Rena Finder's life mission is to raise awareness about the Holocaust and speak out against bigotry.

The 89-year-old Krakow native has her own harrowing story to share. She was one of nearly 1,200 people saved by German industrialist Oskar Schindler, and survived the horrors of Auschwitz-Birkenau.

But Finder suggests that there may have been something worse than the brutality and hopelessness of Auschwitz: The apathy and sudden betrayal of her former neighbors and friends.

"It all happened so suddenly, almost as if it was just overnight," Finder told a packed gathering in the International Lounge at Brandeis on November 7 when describing the start of the Nazi occupation in Poland. "Then, it was just one thing after the other. First Jewish children weren't allowed to go to school, then we are all made to wear a white band with the blue Star of David, then we were forbidden from shopping in the city center, then we were forced into the ghetto."

Finder, who visited campus with support from Facing History and Ourselves and the Center for German and European Studies, recalled the cruelty of being led to the Plaszow concentration camp.

"When we crossed the bridge to leave the city, many people – many of our former neighbors – hurled rocks and mud at us," Finder said.

"They turned on us, the people they used to live with, as if they couldn't see us anymore," Finder added. "It's like the whole world went black and white and we were just invisible."

Finder met Schindler in 1939 when he bribed the Nazi Gestapo into letting him use Plaszow prisoners in his munitions factory. Schindler, a non-Jew, kept his workers well-rested, fed and healthy.

However, Finder's time in Schindler's factory was short-lived. In 1944, the Schutzstaffel ordered Schindler to cease operations and transported his workers to Auschwitz. But Schindler worked to reclaim his former workers, even as they struggled in the concentration camp.

He wrote out a list, now known as Schindler's List, which contained the names of his workers, one of whom was Finder; he then negotiated with the SS to grant those on the list transportation to his new factory in Czechoslovakia.

Finder, who recalls viewing Schindler as if he were an angel during her childhood, used his example as a model for today's society to confront bullies and injustice.

She also took questions from the students, staff and faculty gathered in the Usdan Student Center regarding her life after being liberated from Auschwitz, how she discusses the Holocaust with her children, her emotions when she eventually returned to Poland to visit her former home, and the role today's generation can play in fighting genocide.

"I share my story because this is something that we cannot allow to be forgotten," she said. "But today, it feels similar to Kristallnacht in 1938. It's really a tragedy what recently occurred in Pittsburgh...people are still turning away, even when the same thing is still happening."


