HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Sec. 3.1 Housing facilities, general. (b) Condition and site.

* There are sections of corn-crib paneling, wood boards and an accumulation of equine waste on the ground along the east side of the outdoor enclosure housing two Shiba-inus. This can attract and provide living and breeding areas for insects, pests and other rodents and vermin. As a result, this can increase the disease potential for the dogs. Housing facilities must be free of corn-crib paneling, wood boards and an accumulation of waste. This will reduce potential for insects, pests, rodents and vermin and the disease risks for the dogs.

* There are four miniature horses housed along the east side of the two shida-inus. These miniature horses can injure the dogs or possibly damage the primary enclosure fence allowing the dogs to escape. There must be a barrier between the miniature horses and dogs. This barrier will prevent injury to the dogs and or possible damage to the enclosure primary fencing.

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Sec. 3.1 Housing facilities, general. (c) Surfaces-- (2) Maintenance and replacement of surfaces.

* The wood framed dog door, for the shelter housing two shiba-inus, is excessively chewed and scratched. The rubber flap for this door is excessively chewed along the seams causing a rough surface. These worn and rough surfaces cannot be properly cleaned and sanitized. This can increase the disease potential for the dogs. The wood framing and flap must be replaced or repaired. Surfaces that can be properly cleaned and sanitized will decrease the disease hazards for the dogs.
