It has been some months since we have written a bulletin to you all however, since the Fall Conference and the "notebooks" for all Units with a lot of information in that document, it was time to give you a rest to digest the notebook contents. Now its back to work and a new year.

Until such time as we have NEW information from our national organization or the Dept. Chairmen we will be going over some very important issues. HOW MANY OF YOU KNOW AS AN AUXILIARY MEMBER YOU ARE A MEMBER OF A <u>UNIT NOT A POST?</u>

In reviewing the Secretary of State filings I have found several Units are listing themselves as POSTS. Did you know that the Secretary of States office lists you in both the Post and Unit listing when you put both Unit and Post in your legal name? THIS IS INCORRECT AND FIVE Units will receive letters from this Chairman and Dept. Pres. Cindy Queen telling them they are to file a form with the Secretary of State correcting this information. How many times have we tried to inform the Units about this and to correct their official name to: American Legion Auxiliary (something) UNIT #. Don't make things harder on your Unit when filing legal papers with the Internal Revenue Service, the AZ. Corporation Commission and the office of the Secretary of State. DO IT RIGHT THE FIRST TIME, MAKE COPIES FOR YOUR FILES SO YOU WILL BE CORRECT FROM THEN ON.

Speaking about the I.R.S., the AZ Corporation Commission and Secretary of State forms, approximately 5 to 6 weeks ago Dept. Secretary Barbara Matteson asked each Unit in the Dept. of AZ to forward to her a copy of these filings from their Unit – GUESS WHAT HAPPENED – A GRAND TOTAL OF <u>9 UNITS</u> SUBMITTED THIS INFORMATION TO THE DEPT. OFFICE. What happened to the rest of the Units-did they not read their bulletin or what was the problem or should I say what IS the problem?

As we have said many times the members of the Finance Committee are here to help you, so if you do not understand please contact one of us.

Legislative January 2019

Greetings Ladies,

I had planned to have a full listing of the newly elected officials by this bulletin. Looking at the results, there are too many to list on one sheet of paper. I apologize for this; however you can go to the Arizona Secretary of State's Office website for the listing. The website is <u>www.azsos.gov</u>, and then go to the 2018 Election Results for further info. I will however list the results of the big races, everyone was looking forward to. Speaking of the election, on December 3rd I witnessed in person the official signing and certification of the 2018 Mid Term Election for the State of Arizona by Secretary of State Michele Reagan, Governor Doug Ducey and Attorney General Mark Brnovich.

US Senate - Kyrsten Sinema. Sinema is the first female senator from Arizona.

Governor - Doug Ducey. He is serving his second term as Governor.

Secretary of State - Katie Hobbs. Democrat representing the 24th district; she was previously a state representative. This is her first term as Secretary of State.

Attorney General - Mark Brnovich. He is serving his second term as Attorney General and is a veteran of the US Army National Guard.

Superintendent of Public Instruction - Kathy Hoffman. A Democrat and former educator succeeding Diane Douglas, she is serving her first term as Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Senator Flake gave his farewell address on Thursday December 13th. Kyrsten Sinema is replacing Jeff Flake.

Senator Kyl also gave his farewell address with less than four months on the job, after replacing the late John McCain. As of this bulletin being written, there is talk of Governor Ducey appointing Martha McSally as his replacement, so that she may start the year with everyone else.

On January 7th, 2019, the state of Arizona will be having our Gubernatorial Inauguration ceremonies at the State Capitol in Phoenix. On January 14th, 2019, Governor Ducey will make his State of the State Address in the House of Representatives Chamber at the State Capitol in Phoenix. The Arizona Legislature will also begin the new session.

On November 29th, the President headed to Argentina for the G20 Conference. The USMCA is a new trade agreement replacing NAFTA.

On November 30th, President George H.W. Bush passed. He was a WWII veteran and pilot.

Heather Nauert will replace Nikki Halley as the UN Ambassador.

Replacement for Jeff Sessions will be William Barr.

John Kelly leaving the administration, by the end of the year. New Chief of Staff acting will be Mick Mulvaney.

Thank you again to Nancy Raistrick from Unit 93 in Camp Verde and Anita Ritter from Unit 41 in Phoenix for your continued effort in keeping me apprised of what is happening on the Federal Levels. Things are really starting to ramp up on the home front so to speak on the State level, and I have almost constant access to that. The state capitol is beginning to be a very busy place, so I have been trying to keep up with that.

Visually Impaired Veterans

I BELIEVE

Next month, February, is the month for the Creative Arts Festivals here in Arizona. What better time to talk about a visually impaired artist. Sculptor Michael Naranjo, a Viet Nam war veteran blinded by a grenade, lives in Santa Clara Pueblo in New Mexico. His sculptures are "meant to be touched." His works are displayed at the Smithsonian Institute where tactile aids and verbal descriptions help visually impaired to enjoy art. His sculptures are also in the White House and the Vatican. You can view one of his sculptures at the Heard Museum in Phoenix. Mr. Naranjo says; "being blind makes the pace of life slower, you can't walk fast or grab things quickly. Life is more gentle."

October 6 is Blind Sports Day in the US. This last September, 5 blinded veterans took Kayaks down the Colorado River, traveling 226 miles from Lees Ferry, Colorado, to Diamond Creek near Flagstaff, Arizona. The trip took 12 days.

An 83 year old legally blind Korean War veteran has accumulated over 800 skydiving jumps thanks to a Father's Day gift from his daughter in 2017!

These are major accomplishments for visually impaired veterans. Loosing ones sight is not only a physical impairment; emotionally it can take a heavy toll. I have seen personally blind individuals withdraw into a world of self-consciousness feeling helpless and worthless. Loved ones often are not prepared to deal with the emotional challenges. With help like the VA Low Vision programs, visually impaired veterans can overcome their fears and live meaningful lives.

The new Residential Mental Health Rehabilitation facility is now open. This added 25 new beds to house Veterans in various treatment programs with on-site housing on the hospital campus. We ordered 150 backpacks and water bottles and provided colored pencils in June, 2018. The Building 95 donation was made possible largely by a very generous donation from Unit 66.
