Valuable Lesson With Fear and Emptiness...

John 21:7, "That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the sea through faith. So do not become proud, but stand in awe."

A 26-year-old pilot Mike Peterson was all alone in a pit of pitch black darkness. Vietnamese soldiers were searching for him, after his plane was crashed behind enemy lines. Mike was hiding in the pit for 2 days, but could be found anytime soon by ruthless Viet Cong who could discover his hide out at any moment. It was their jungle, so they knew the possible places Mike could remain covered. He was frightened of the hunger, cold and death. However the ultimate fear was missing his mom and dad back home.

The enemies were coming closer, and his terror was intensifying. At that moment, one Scripture verse flashed through his mind. It was Mark 8:18, "You have eyes but fail to see." So, he prayed that the Viet Cong would fail to see him. Finally, the Vietnamese soldiers came as close as two feet, but they couldn't find him. To them, he was invisible.

Later he applied his personal story to transform his faith into a higher level; when he was invisible, and empty, God would come to him with His miracle and blessings.

Peter went away like the other disciples when Jesus died on the cross. He must have been disappointed in what happened to his master and felt like he had lost his life's purpose. So, he went back to his old lifestyle as a fisherman, but his life was never the same. He might have felt like he was a failure. Was he? It looks like he was. He had lost everything; his Master, his dreams, and his hope. His life and his inner being felt empty. He was sitting, naked, in his empty boat.

That's when Jesus chose to come to him, in order to teach him the most important and vital lesson on earth: It is the Lord



who made his life meaningful. Jesus waited for that moment when Peter felt naked and empty, when Peter had finally stripped off all the things that he had held on to; fear, pride, and a sense of security. Then Jesus made Peter a true follower of His.

<u>God is looking at how deep you are in your faith</u>. God is waiting for you to be completely genuine and sincere about Him and His words. When you stand up in your nakedness and emptiness, God will come to you and fulfill you with His Spirit and grace. You will become who you're supposed to be; His true follower. So being the real you is God's priority. His blessing comes with your authenticity.



Financial Faithfulness - Can God Trust in You?

... Excerpts from an article by Steven J. Cole

It is a given fact in today's world that there is a lack of people who are faithful enough to pick up a task they have been assigned, to do it well, and to follow through without 3. To be faithful in finances, I must be hard-working and complaint or harassment.

This rare quality—faithfulness should not be rare among God's people. It is in fact, a fruit of the Holy spirit; and, it applies directly to our handling of money. Not only do we need to trust in God; He should be able to trust in us because we have proven ourselves to be faithful. The testing ground for faithfulness is money:

Here are four biblical facets of financial faithfulness:

1. To be faithful in finances, I must operate as the manager, not the owner.

Jesus pointedly said that our money is not ours, but, "that which is another's", namely God's. God is the true owner of everything and everyone. Jesus said you cannot serve God and material possessions, or riches. He clearly means that either God or money is our master, but not both. There is no middle ground.

Thus, one of the fundamental principles in the realm of money is: I do not own anything; I only manage the money and possessions that God has entrusted to me. God does not own just ten percent, so that I'm free to spend the rest as I please. He owns it all, and as manager of God's assets, I should be responsible.

2. To be faithful in finances, I must keep the Owner's objectives in mind.

Managers must know and carry out the will of the owner. Managers are not free to take a business any way they choose, unless the owner has given them that prerogative. They must work closely with the owner, under his direction, to find out how he wants his business managed and to then carry out his purpose. The primary way that the Owner (God) wants His managers to use their money is to further His kingdom. Could somebody tell by looking at our checkbook and the way we spend our money that we are managers for the Owner who are not willing that any

should perish, but wants some from every tongue and tribe and nation to come to faith in Jesus Christ? A faithful manager keeps the owners objectives in mind.

obedient to the Owner.

No owner is pleased with a lazy manager who doesn't follow directions. To please our Owner, we must work hard and follow the instructions He gives us in His Word about money. I must be industrious and not lazy; I must provide for my family and have extra to give to those in need; I must be orderly with finances; and, I must be resourceful.

4. To be faithful in finances, I must follow through with the Owner's plan.

It doesn't do any good to start as good managers if we get sloppy and don't follow through. Setting up a budget is a start; sticking to it and making it work Is financial faithfulness. Promising to give systematically is wonderful; doing it is faithfulness to the Owner. Jesus said that the faithful servant is the one whom his master found doing his job when he returned.

Your response to this message may be to feel overwhelmed. Your management of the finances God has entrusted to you is so bad that you don't know where to begin. Don't let the enormity of the task make you procrastinate. Ask God to help you pick the most important area first, and begin there. Perhaps you have been acting as the owner, squandering everything on yourself; you need to turn your finances over to the true Owner and start managing it for Him. Maybe you need to work on a budget that is in line with the Owner's priorities. Perhaps you need to set up a filing system or a will. Maybe you are sloppy about giving to the Owner's cause.

Whatever the area, start being faithful there. Remember, if you are faithful in the use of unrighteous riches, God will not entrust true riches to you! If you are faithful, you will someday hear the joyous words, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things, enter into the joy of your master"...Matthew 25:21.




