

### ( Pastor's Page

"Now there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone... Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body." 1 Corinthians 12:4-6, 14-15



As I write this, we are only a few weeks away from Holy Week and then Easter. During this Lenten season, I have been reading *Turning Over Tables* by Kathy Escobar and it is also the book grounding our midweek gatherings. In this devotional, Escobar uses the following themes as a road map for Lent: **Enter, Open, Reveal, Lament, Repent, Disrupt, Cultivate** and **Illuminate**. These all lead to the Easter themes of **Embody** and **Sustain**.

Walking through this book and walking with Christ through our Biblical text each week, I am reminded of the lessons Jesus is constantly trying to teach and that we, even today, continue to misunderstand or even avoid - we are sinful people and a lot of what we value is harmful to others and the opposite of what God is calling us to be. It's hard to really look in the mirror and reveal, lament and repent the parts of ourselves that work against the kindom of God. But without those steps, we can't get to the next steps - disrupt, cultivate and illuminate. And it is those steps that lead us to truly embody the Gospel and to sustain the changes that God wants for us. And, we can't do any of this alone. Through all the steps, we need each other. We need to be mirrors to each other, support beams, soft places to land, even cheerleaders.

But, as the above passage from 1 Corinthians reminds us, we can't all be all things. We are all made unique and that includes our unique strengths and weaknesses. If we go it alone, we won't have the means to do what we are called to do. It has to be done together.

My hope for the rest of 2025 and beyond, is that we as Calvary, can come together, work together and then celebrate together in making the kindom in our little piece of the world. That we can come together with our ecumenical partners and support them and be supported by them. That we can remember that all our differences are what make us strong.

We will have many opportunities (Good Friday worship, the Easter Egg Hunt, Interfaith Advocacy Day and more) to gather together and with others to show that love and grace and calls for justice that Christ taught. So let's stand together, let's work together, and let's embody the Easter story of new life for all people.



### **Book Club Gathering**

Everyone is welcome to join book club discussions. Our next meeting is April 22 at 1:30 pm at Margaret Deveraux Jefferies' house (262 NE 18th Ave, Hillsboro). You do not need to have finished the book to join the discussion. Just be aware that often the questions have spoilers. Please feel free to join us for fellowship if you haven't read the book.



April's humorous fiction is *How the Penguins Saved Veronica* by Hazel Prior, 2020. This book is about a curmudgeonly, charming, eighty-five-year-old grandmother who is estranged from her family and wants to find a worthwhile cause to leave her fortune to. She convinces a scientific team in Antarctica to rescue an orphaned baby penguin. Together, Veronica, her grandson Patrick, and even the scientists learn what family, love, and connections are all about. The public library has 4 books, 1 large print books, 2 eBooks, and 2 downloadable audiobooks. Sandy will coordinate the discussion.

Coming May 27:--Braiding Sweetgrass: Indigenous Wisdom, Scientific Knowledge, and the Teachings of Plants by Robin Wall Kimmerer, 2013 (first edition) and 2020 (hardcover second edition)

As a botanist, Robin Wall Kimmerer has been trained to ask questions of nature with the tools of science. As a member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, she embraces the notion that plants and animals are our oldest teachers. In Braiding Sweetgrass, Kimmerer brings these two lenses of knowledge together. In reflections that range from the creation of Turtle Island to the forces that threaten its flourishing today, she circles toward a central argument: that the awakening of ecological consciousness requires the acknowledgment and celebration of our reciprocal relationship with the rest of the living world..


