Minor Miracles

Monday night, May 13, 2019, our youngest son asked
if I had seen his box of contact lenses. We looked all
over the house for them, but didn't find them.

I laid awake racking my brain, mentally walking
through cleaning off the bathroom counter Sunday
morning before heading to church. I thought maybe I
had accidentally thrown them in the trash while
clearing off the bathroom counter.

Most of our trash winds up in the recycle bin in the
kitchen, and then later gets dumped into the large
recycle bin in the garage. Monday evenings we roll
the recycling out to the curb to get picked up Tuesday
around 7 AM.

I couldn't sleep thinking about where those contacts
might be. So around 3 AM I got up to look through
the small recycle bin in the kitchen. I had told our
oldest son to make sure he emptied the recycling
before I got in the bed. He had informed me that he
couldn't because the large bin in the garage was full.
Since the bin in the kitchen was still full, I decided to
take everything out piece by piece, looking for the box
of contacts. Taking the lid off, I had sorted through the
paper, pop cans, styrofoam and cardboard boxes, but
still didn't find what I was looking for.

Instead, I found my gold wedding band. I thought
maybe I had knocked it off of the nightstand and it
had rolled somewhere in our room or under the bed. I
had looked for over a week and had even bought a
tungsten band as a temporary replacement, but it never
felt right. Immediately, I replaced everything taken out
of the recycle bin and washed my hands and the ring
thoroughly. Then I slipped it back on and whispered a
prayer of thanksgiving.

This wedding band is precious to me. The first thing
Angela and I bought after we decided to get married
in 1991 were our rings. Her rings have been upgraded
a few times, but I've always worn this original band.
For a week, it had been lost. Now it was found - in the
recycle bin, on a night when the bin should have been
empty.

Happenstance? I think not. I'm counting this as a
minor miracle...and a reminder.

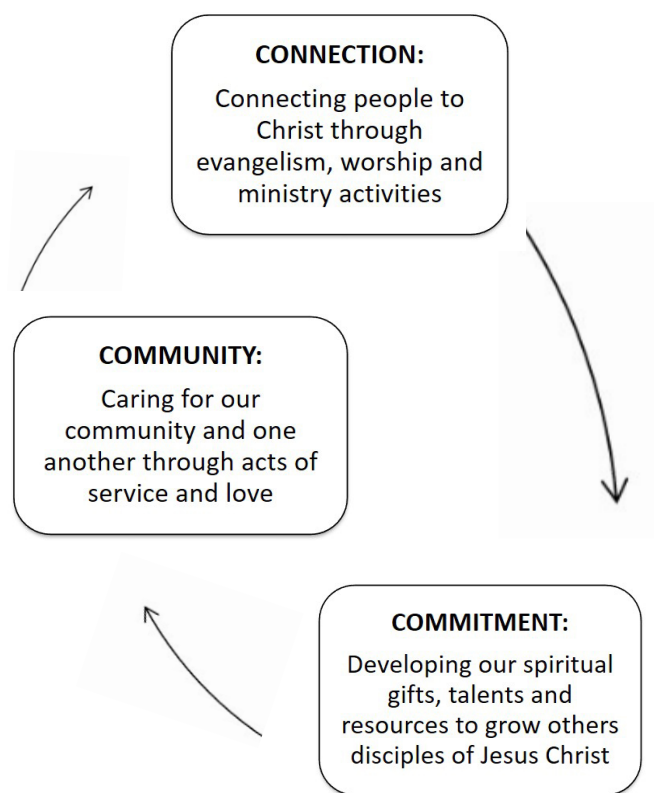
