Cadillac and Henry Ford

Did you know there's a historic connection between Cadillac and Henry Ford? Before he started today's Ford Motor Company, Henry started a car company called the Henry Ford Company in 1901 after his first attempt, The Detroit Automobile Company failed. Henry had this vision of building an inexpensive car for the masses. Up to this point automobiles were a plaything only for the wealthy. The investors didn't share Henry's vision and he left the company in 1902. The company reorganized itself and changed the name to Cadillac. It continued the pursuit of building a car for the wealthy, not the masses, and became part of the fledgling General Motors Corporation in 1909. Cadillac continues as General Motors' flagship brand to this day. It is interesting that the early Cadillacs were nearly identical to Ford's 1903 Model A, except with a different engine.

Inspired by the Model T club, the Rockford Model A club recently adopted a couple of our practices and policies. They have extended free membership to members 85+ years of age and they are also going to start donating a portion of their profits to local charities. It's nice to see that an interest in old Fords isn't the only thing the two clubs have in common.
