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PROCESS FOR RECONSIDERATION: The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for Reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action. If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the next meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a (Proposed) Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A motion for reconsideration can only be made by a Board Member, who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken. If the motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board Member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Recording Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforementioned shall be in compliance with the Brown Act.

PROCESS FOR FILING A GRIEVANCE: Any grievance must be submitted to the Governing Board in writing. The Governing Board will acknowledge the grievance within ten (10) working days of receipt of the written grievance. The Governing Board will then schedule a meeting within forty-five (45) days in an attempt to resolve the grievance. In the event the grievance cannot be resolved by the Governing Board, a mediator or arbitrator will be obtained for assistance. If the mediator or arbitrator is unable to resolve the issue, the grieved may, within ten (10) days, appeal to DONE, who will make the final decision on the disposition of the grievance.

The Governing Board of the NDC will abide by all applicable provisions of the City's Governmental Ethics Ordinance, as set forth in the Los Angeles Municipal Code § 49.5.1.,. The Governing Board will also abide by all applicable laws of the Federal, State & Local Government.
