

## Barry Armstrong, SP4, USA Nha Trang (72-73)





My father was in Nha Trang AFVN. He was SP4 Barry Lee Armstrong, 72 to 73. He took Basic at Fort Ord. I believe he was an [electronics] engineer. He died in 2006 from complications due to exposure to agent orange at age 53. But he was a happy person who never brought up Vietnam or the war.

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## Message from Bruce Eaton, August 8, 2018

He served with AFVN Detachment #4. TV and FM radio stations were on Hon Tre Island off the coast of Nha Trang. The AM radio station was at Dong Ba Thin, south of Nha Trang near the Cam Ranh Bay Air Base. I was Detachment OIC 1967-68.

Thanks Bruce, that's some good info about my dad's service. All I have is his records but not much else. I'm to become a 92-Romeo Parachute Rigger eventually.
