



PINAL COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE RENAMES SAN TAN VALLEY FAMILY ADVOCACY CENTER MEDICAL ROOM AFTER GEORGE JOHNSON

The Pinal County Attorney's Office receives donations of medical equipment for the San Tan Valley Family Advocacy Center thanks to \$40,000 in public donations to the Arizona Public Safety Foundation.

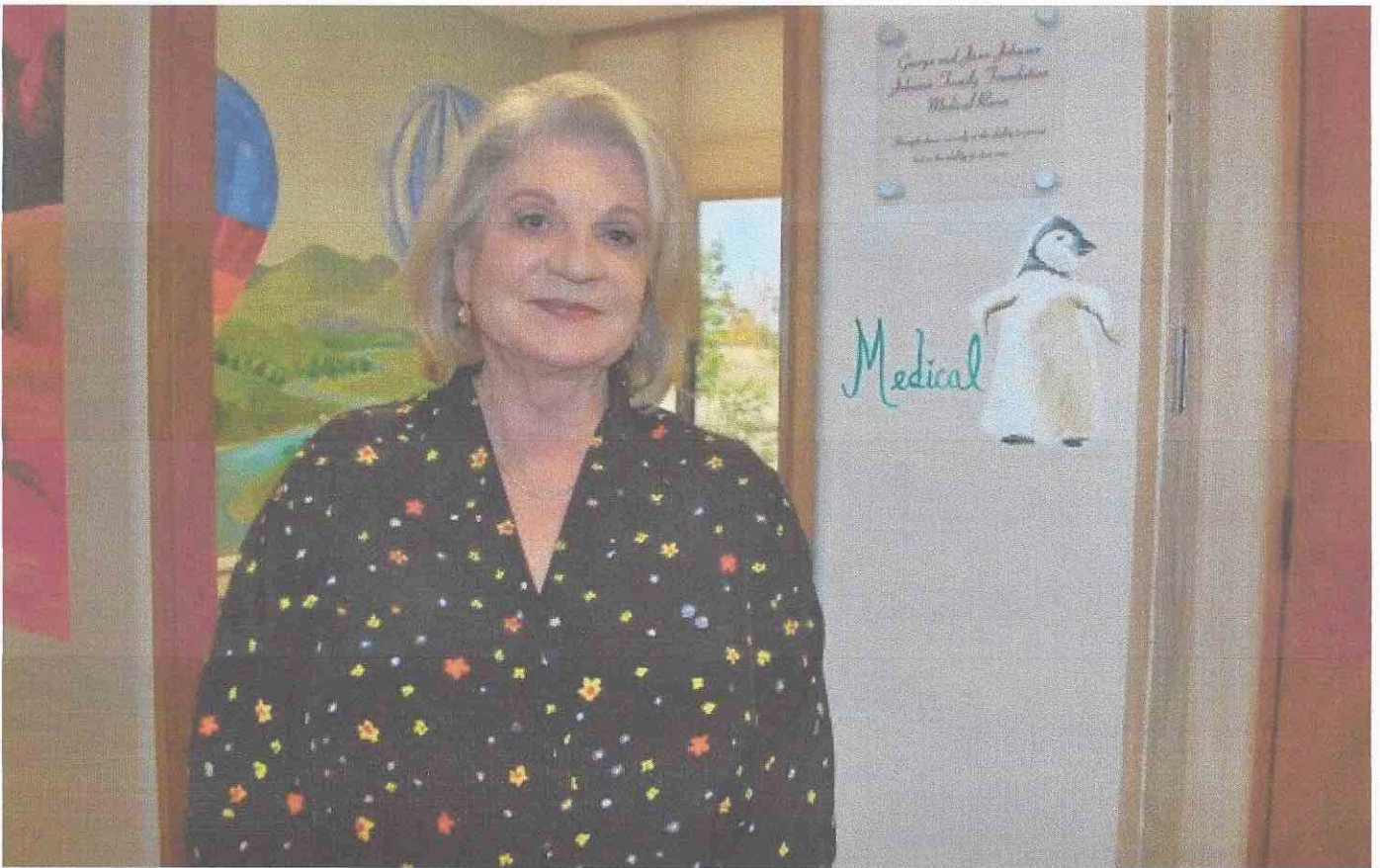
Recently, AZPSF purchased a digital blood pressure machine and digital forensic imaging equipment for the STV FAC after they received a \$30,000 donation from George and Jana Johnson, through the Johnson Family Foundation, and a \$10,000 donation from an anonymous donor.

The imaging equipment helps interviewers and medical staff document medical examinations or evaluations utilizing high definition technology. The equipment also provides secure storage of the images. It allows law enforcement and FAC staff to safely send the documents using encrypted coding to other agencies involved in the case. "In ways that are often immeasurable, the generosity of donors carries victims through some extremely difficult times. Utilizing state of the art medical imaging in a comfortable setting, like the Family Advocacy Center, we can minimize these additional stresses that can be part of the investigation and prosecution of violent crimes," said Family Advocacy Centers Directors, Dr. Tascha Spears.

"George and Jana Johnson continue to make positive impacts in our Pinal County communities. Through their generous donation, Family Advocacy Center staff can fulfill their mission to our community more effectively. With both Family Advocacy Centers operating on limited budgets, the two donations will have a huge impact on the San Tan Valley location. Every month, an average of 60 children arrive at one of PCAO's FACs for a forensic interview and medical examination as part of a law enforcement investigation.
