From the Pastor's Study

Dear Friends,

The City Council of Beloit has removed the city's mask mandate and social distancing requirements as of Monday, May 17. Consequently, we have removed the tape from the pews and are no longer specifically requesting that worshippers wear face coverings at St. John's. However, those who feel

more comfortable wearing face coverings are more than welcome to continue doing so. In fact, I will continue to wear a face covering as I distribute the Lord's Supper. We also ask everyone to be intentional in respecting each other's space and distancing preferences.

In the world, there are "vaxxers" and "anti-vaxxers" - as well as "maskers" and "anti-maskers" - but in Christ's Church there is only the baptized. The values and struggles of our culture so dominate our lives that we sometimes forget that the Church is not of this world. It is important for us to be reminded that in the Church, we follow Christ not the world. One's identity as a baptized child of God supersedes all other identifying values. St. Paul reminded the church gathered in Galatia of this when he wrote "In fact, you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. Indeed, as many of you as were baptized into Christ have been clothed with Christ. There is not Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female, for you are all one and the same in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:26-28, EHV). Perhaps you believe that all people should be vaccinated without delay, or maybe you believe that no one should be vaccinated. In Christ, you are free to hold that opinion but you are not called upon to impose it on others within the household of God. Perhaps you are appalled that we are no longer asking all worshippers to wear face coverings, or maybe you think that it is ridiculous that we made this request for so long. Again, our own opinions regarding such things do nothing to build up the body of Christ - which is the Church.

In the ancient world, a myriad of so-called "gods" were worshipped. Animals were frequently offered in the temples of these "gods." Frequently, meat remaining from their sacrifices were sold to the public to eat. This caused an uproar among many Christians who said to eat this meat is to acknowledge those "gods" and amounted to worshipping them. Paul reminded them that because those "gods" do not actually exist their worship is a falsehood, however, he helped Christians to see that respecting one another's consciences within the body of Christ is far superior to expecting them to unconditionally accept our opinions. As we consider masking and vaccinations, we do well to listen to Paul's words regarding meat sacrificed to false "gods."

"So, concerning the eating of food from idol sacrifices, we know that an idol is not anything real in the world and that there is no God but one. Indeed, even if there are so-called "gods," whether in the heavens or on earth (as in fact there are many "gods" and many "lords"), nevertheless for us there is one God—the Father, from whom all things exist and we exist for him—and one Lord—Jesus Christ, through whom all things exist and we exist through him.

However, that knowledge is not in everyone. Instead some, who are still affected by their former habit with the idol, eat the food as something sacrificed to an idol, and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. Food will not bring us closer to God. We do not lack anything if we do not eat, nor are we better off if we do. And be careful that this right of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. For if someone sees you, a person who has knowledge, dining in an idol's temple, will not the conscience of this man, weak as he is, be emboldened to eat food from an idol sacrifice? You see, the weak person is being destroyed by your knowledge—the brother for whose sake Christ died! And when you sin in this way against your brothers and wound their weak conscience, you sin against Christ. Therefore, if food causes my brother to sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I do not cause my brother to sin." (1 Cor. 8:4–13, EHV).

In the world, it is considered acceptable to judge people according to their use of face coverings and decision to be vaccinated or not, but in the Church we are called to a higher level of respect. There are legitimate reasons for choosing to be vaccinated and equally-legitimate reasons for not being vaccinated. Because of my allergies (peanuts, etc.), I was not an ideal candidate to receive the vaccine. Convinced that not doing so would prevent me from being able to make visits in the hospitals and nursing care facilities, I signed up to be vaccinated a few months ago. Following the administration of my second dose, I ran a fever for 30 hours before it finally broke. For the next four days, I ran a fever every night. I dreaded bedtime until this cycle finally ended. Given my experience, I cannot accept that everyone must be vaccinated. However, I also believe that the increasing number of those being vaccinated has much to do with the lessening of active COVID diagnoses. Thus, I also respect the decision of those who have chosen to be vaccinated.

May each one of us use our Christian freedom to give one another space in these matters.

Voters' Meeting

Our Church Council has called a special meeting of the Voters' Assembly for Sunday, June 20, immediately following worship.

The purpose of this meeting is to consider a proposal to enter into a long-term lease agreement with Family Promise of Greater Beloit (formerly Hands of Faith). This not-for-profit community organization works to prevent homelessness among Beloit residents and to provide shelter to those who are experiencing homelessness.

They are interested in entering into a ten-year lease agreement with us for the use of the three classrooms, kitchen, and lockerrooms in the new school building ('82); and the three downstairs classrooms in the first school building ('51). Their intention is to establish a permanent facility that can shelter up to six families at any given time. The Midwest Tarheels Select Sports organization will continue to occupy the gym and the upstairs classrooms in the first school building ('51) on a month-to-month basis. Because of the length of the lease and the building modifications that will need to be undertaken (at Family Promise's expense), the Council is bringing this before the Voters for approval. If you have questions, please speak with Pastor or any of our Council members. We are excited about this opportunity to bless our community through the resources that God has placed into our care.

Special June Sermon Series

It would be quite unfeeling for us to ask you if you have experienced a sense of isolation during the last year. During the pandemic, each of us has experienced isolation in some way, and many people to a very large extent. Because God has created us as social beings intended for life in community, much of what we have experienced in order to reduce the spread of the virus has been unnatural and painful. Just as God's merciful care gets us through each new week, with its unique challenges, God also refreshes us with the gifts of community received through the local congregation.

During the Sundays in June, Pastor will be presenting a five-part message series entitled "Overcoming Isolation through Community." This series springs from the new book by LCMS pastor, Rev. 
