Check-in: Each registrant will hand-in a fully completed, signed, PSA Indemnity Form, including "Leo Carrillo Ranch Historic Park" as the name of the activity. Once the indemnity form has been received from a participant, they will receive a color-coded sticker/label to wear during this walk-about only. The Park requires ALL PHOTOGRAPHERS to spend about 2 minutes to go over the Park Photography Rules/Regulations, and sign that each photographer has read and understand those rules. Each participant will then be allowed to enter Leo Carrillo Ranch Historic Park.

History: Discover the history and tranquil beauty of this former working ranch, once owned by actor Leo Carrillo (the Cisco Kid's 'Pancho'). The site still includes some of the original buildings and the original swimming pool. Secluded in the heart of a magnificently landscaped 27-acre canyon, this historic park contains and protects romantic hand-crafted adobe buildings, antique windmills, and many other beautiful historic structures where visitors can explore and experience California history. Nature-lovers delight in gorgeous agave, bougainvillea, Birds of Paradise, plentiful trees and the company of dozens of brilliant peacocks who live here on the ranch. Hopefully we will be able to capture the white peacock who also calls this ranch home.

The group will be able photograph at leisure until 11:30 am with the leaders. Participants may elect to spend more time (if you wish) until closing at 5:00 pm.
