

The second parable that Jesus tells in Luke 18 addresses attitude in prayer. In contrasting the prayer of the Pharisee with the prayer of the tax collector, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray in humility before God. Jesus again surprises listeners by showing the tax

collector as the example of faith, rather than the Pharisee. Remember that Pharisees were members of a sect of Judaism active in Jesus' time. They taught an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses as the basis for Jewish piety. If anyone would be a model for prayer, a Pharisee was a likely candidate. In contrast, Jesus offers the tax collector as a model for prayer. Tax collectors were collaborators with the Roman authorities in a system that allowed the tax collectors to line their own pockets by charging in excess of the defined taxes. Yet, in this parable, Jesus offers the humility of the tax collector as a model for the prayer of a disciple. The parable reminds us that when we pray, we must remember our need for God in our lives. If we are too full of ourselves, there is too little room for God's grace to work in us.

10 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT JUBILEE YEAR 2025 (Continued)

Pope Frances noted that jubilee pilgrims were likely to visit Rome's Christian catacombs and its seven pilgrim churches — the basilicas of St. Peter, St. Mary Major, St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. Lawrence, Holy Cross and St. Sebastian — destinations St. Philip Neri popularized in the 16th century with a 15-mile walk. Twelve other Roman churches, including the Sanctuary of Divine Love in southeast Rome, are designated "jubilee churches" intended as gathering spots for pilgrims

during the jubilee. Major events have happened in Rome, including jubilee gatherings with liturgles, speakers and papal audiences to celebrate different groups within the church. Some gatherings that have taken place—Jubilee of the World of Communications, Jubilee of the Armed Forces, Police and Security Personne. The jubilee has included gatherings for artists, deacons and even marching bands and gatherings for the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis during the Jubilee of Teenagers and the canonization of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati during the Jubilee of Young People. Events have highlighted the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, from which Christians received the Nicene Creed. This year the dates for celebrating Easter aligned in the Catholic Church and the Orthodox Church, leading some to call for a "decisive step forward towards unity around a common date for Easter," which was discussed in 325 at the Council of Nicaea. OCTOBER 28 - FEAST OF SAINT SIMON AND SAINT JUDE. APOSTLES: Simon the Zealot is thus named because of his zeal for the law. Jude (Judas) is often referred to as Thaddeus or the son (or the brother) of James to distinguish him from Judas Iscariot. Jude is also known as a patron saint of hopeless cases. Both these apostles suffered martvrdom.

PARISH MINISTRIES (Times Scheduled)

- Readers: Proclaim the Word of God (1st and 2nd Readings and Responsorial Psalm if no choir) at weekend Masses (once a month) and special feasts such as Christmas and Easter.
- Presenters of Gifts usually 2 people or a family present the Gifts at the weekend Masses about once every 6 weeks.
- Hospitality greet parishioners as they enter the Church on the weekends about once a month.
- Sacristans prepare for Mass (put vessels on the side table, light the candles, ensure correct readings are in place for the Readers, etc.). Once a week all vessels are washed and candles prepared. Usually a sacristan is present for the weekday Masses.
- Altar Servers carry the Cross (to lead the procession before and after Mass) and candles for weekend Masses and funerals and special occasions, serve the priest during Mass.



On Tuesday, October 7th the Catholic Church celebrated the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. At St. Joseph's Parish a Rosary and

Healing Prayer Service was held on Tuesday, October 21st. It was a beautiful opportunity for parishioners to pray together.
