From the Minister's Mac

All Hallows Day

You wouldn't think that Halloween would be controversial, but in certain circles, it is. While many children in this country keep alive the tradition of donning a costume and receiving candy from their neighbors, others are taught that it is a pagan holiday to be avoided at all costs.

This culture clash was first brought to my attention at a church I served which had multi-cultural ministries all sharing space equally. The

English language ministry wanted to have a Halloween party for the church and neighborhood children. The Vietnamese and Spanish language ministries felt it was inappropriate and didn't want their children to participate.

What to do?

After much conversation, we decided to have an Angel Party, where all the kids dressed like little angels, which of course, they were. They had fun playing games and eating snacks. The only problem for me was that this party was not open to the neighborhood. Their fear was that neighborhood kids wouldn't understand what an Angel Party was and would come as demons or chainsaw-wielding serial killers. Although the original idea was to offer hospitality to the neighborhood via this Halloween party, the English-language ministry felt it was more important to build trust within the church and so, in the spirit of compromise, went along with the Angel Party.

Over the years, I have thought a lot about that church, that party, that compromise. Were we right to exclude the neighborhood children? Did we miss an opportunity to minister to them? Did we gain trust within the church or create resentment? And I can't help thinking theologically: Is this a pagan holiday that should be ignored? Have we as a society completely forgotten the Christian Feast of All Saints Day, previously called All Hallows Day? Have we rejected the purpose of honoring the dead in favor of glorifying vampires and zombies?

For me, which came first — the Gaelic tradition of Samhain, the Aztec tradition of the Day of the Dead, or the Christian tradition of All Saints Day — is not as important as remembering what our traditions are all about. All Saints Day, which is always November 1 and celebrated in church on the following Sunday, began as a day to remember the Christian martyrs. It has evolved into a day of remembering and honoring our loved ones who have died, and to celebrate our connection with them through our belief in eternal life.

And Halloween? Well, the United Methodist Church doesn't have an official stance on this holiday, leaving local churches to decide for themselves whether or not to celebrate. For the record, I'm for it! I love seeing the parade of princesses and pirates, ghosts and ghouls, burritos and Beetlejuice Bobs. We get about 100 kids, if the weather is good, and even when the weather is bad, our neighborhood is a hub of trick-

or-treat activity. And I love it!

So, have fun out there tonight and stay safe. And whether you're going door-to-door or handing out treats, consider saying a prayer for the little ones and for us, that God will bless us all, despite our crazy controversies.


