Building & Grounds Trustees: Trustees have been working on a chronic freezeup situation with our air conditioning system for the sanctuary. This occurred in late June, mid-July, and as recently as August 17. We are able to maintain cooling if the condensation line checked and cleaned weekly. (Bacterial sludge has been plugging the line and precipitating the AC freeze-up.) We are going to try some bactericide tablets in the condensate pan this week to see if we can eliminate the line plugging problem. The old surplus vacuum was sold in early July. We continue to advertise the availability of a surplus floor cleaning machine. We plan to put up for sale the old "Welcome Center" desk in September. Tree limb pruning is also planned for September.


# THERE IS ROOM **FOR YOU**

Our August collection is money and items for the Winter Wear Giveaway at Bdecan. Many of the students are on the bus for long periods each day, and need the warm clothes in case of a breakdown on the lessthan-perfect roads around



their homes, as well as for going out at recess. We set a goal of collecting \$1,000 to assist in clothing some of the about 160 students they outfit each year. If you haven't already, please give generously, either in the offering plate or online. Thank you for your support.

In September, we will be PATH collecting new household items for students served by Nexus-PATH who are aging out of the foster system, and could use some support in setting up their first apartments. 

In this Bible study, we will explore resilience. This is modeled for us by several biblical characters, gospel and epistle writers, as well as Jesus. So, what exactly is resilience?

Resilience is the ability to spring back into shape and to adapt well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats, or stress—such as from family, relationships, health, workplace, and financial stressors. People who survive and thrive well in change are resilient.

The Bible study is also about joy. How do we find joy in a chaotic world? Christian joy may be different from how a lot of people define joy.

Joy is sometimes confused with happiness. For Christians, joy can occur while we are in the midst of difficult circumstances. Joy is the second fruit of the spirit, preceded by love and followed by peace. [Gal. 5:22-23] Trusting in God when we are in trying times can fill us with glorious joy and peace. We have joy in our suffering, because ultimately our joy is found in Jesus Christ.

We will also seek to rediscover our identity.

Identity is more than who we are or who we show ourselves to be. At its core, it points to our humanity. Our core identity is not found in our titles, our positions, our spouses, our partners, or our possessions. For Christians, our identity is found in Jesus Christ.


