



## JohnDeere Finds His Furever Home

JohnDeere came to us on 1/11/24. He was scared and extremely skinny. He quickly captured our volunteer, Erika's, heart. She requested to begin fostering him on 1/16/24. Since then, Erika, her 3 kids, and her husband have loved on JohnDeere and got him to the weight he needed to be. He was a part of their family in every way. We got a well-qualified application in for him and Erika brought him in to meet his potential furever pet mom. Robin took one look at him and her eyes began to tear up. She had lost her Greyhound not too long ago and she just fell in love with JohnDeere. JohnDeere took right to her. Erika said, "This is the perfect match for him". We know it had to be hard on Erika and her husband but she said "I have prayed about it and God sent the perfect person for him". She was RIGHT! What an amazing thing they did for JohnDeere so he could be healthy and happy to join Robin and help her heal from her recent loss. This is why we do what we do!

## YOU ROCK!

WOW!!! Can you believe that this year is halfway over? Or as we would like to think, this year has 6 months left! Six months left to rescue as MANY animals as possible from the Stokes County Animal Shelter. Six months left to find the PERFECT home for these sweeties. So far this year we have rescued 187 animals, placed 121 into loving homes, and sent 39 to rescues so foster homes could be found to place them in too! The average stay for dogs has been 20 days and for cats 17 days. That is pretty darn incredible. During those days that they were with us, they were loved on, trained, socialized, and assessed so they could be placed in the right home. While in our care, 66 have been spayed/neutered, the others were altered, or their pet parent has had this done. We follow up with the adopters around two months after they have been in their new home. We ask the adopter how things are going, whether the pet has been spayed or neutered (if they left the facility unaltered), and if they have any suggestions on how FOSS Animal Adoption Center can make this process easier.

Compared to 2023, we have rescued 40 more animals, adopted 16 more animals, and sent 9 more to rescues.

How do we get this done?? By having AMAZING volunteers and generous supporters like yourselves!! There is NO possible way that we could have done this without them and YOU! The volunteers have put in 3965.4 volunteer hours (so far this year)! That is INCREDIBLE! Our team can do this because YOU support this facility AND our animals. Anytime we have made a plea for food, medical needs, or financial needs, YOU step up to the plate BEYOND what we ever expected. Thank you from the bottoms of our hearts and from the hearts of these 187 animals that YOU have rescued this year.
