Retired Elkton banker E. J. Ramseyer dies fan 2

Retired Elkton banker and Oliver Township official Elvin J. Ramseyer, 80, died Wednesday at Scheurer Hospital, Pigeon, following a short illness.

Mr. Ramseyer served Elkton banks for about 40 years, beginning as a book-keeper in 1928 with Frank W. Hubbard and Company. The bank later became Elkton State Bank, where he became a director, vice-president, and chief executive officer. In 1956, the bank was renamed Hubbard State Bank, which Mr. Ramseyer served on the board of directors. He retired from banking in October 1966.

He was the Oliver Township clerk for 43 years, from 1935 to 1978, and was the treasurer of the Bay Port United Methodist Youth Camp, Sebewaing, for 15 years. Mr. Ramseyer was treasurer for the Huron County United Fund for 14 years and was past secretary and a member of the Elkton Rotary club.

Mr. Ramseyer was a veteran of World War I and a member of the Bad Axe Drum and Bugle Corps of the Sherman-Elvin American Legion Post No. 96.

Mr. Ramseyer was also a member of the Elkton United Methodist Church and was secretary of the church board for many years.


He was born Jan. 13, 1899, in Elkton, son of the late John and Maryann Ramseyer.
