- The auditors recommendations from 2017-18 audit were corrected mid fiscal year so they are still on 2018-19 audit, but they have been corrected. The City is operating in the black. The auditors issued an unmodified opinion which means an opinion where auditor expresses an opinion that financial statements are presented, in all material respects, in accordance with applicable financial reporting framework. Electric and Water Departments are both operating with a 7.6 % loss, which means 7.6 % is not billed and collected. Example are streetlights, flushing fire hydrants, water main leaks, Christmas lights, Fire Protection, etc. It was a clean audit which indicates the auditor's belief that the entity's financial statements fairly present its financial results, financial position, and cash flows.
