Tennessee Annual Conference Report From Edwin Moore

Recently, I had the privilege of attending the 2016 Tennessee Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church and being one of the delegates of the Pulaski FUMC. At the conference much emphasis was placed on reporting back to each of our local congregations by answering three questions in order to let you know where God fits into our lives and our churches.

The first question was: Where did I see God at work during the Annual Conference? In every speaker and every report it was easy to see God at work. Emphasis was placed on our need to stay focused on Jesus. Much of the conference was like attending an exciting worship service. There is no doubt that God is alive in the United Methodist Church. Not only did the speakers show God at work, but each attendee at the conference. It was a pleasure to be surrounded by fellow Christians. In private conversations, it was amazing to hear about the activities in which many of the churches are involved in their local communities much like the Pulaski FUMC.

Question two was: What was most meaningful for me as a delegate that I will share with Pulaski FUMC. This is similar to the challenge Pastor Lee makes to us every Sunday by saying: "We exist to make disciples of Jesus Christ by engaging, connecting, equipping, and sending people for Christ and making our community a better place to live".

Tennessee Annual Conference Report from Sally Hobbs

- 1. Where did I see God at annual Conference? God's presence was constantly visible in many ways. The other most meaningful moment was the Service of Ordination. I think of it like a preacher's graduation ceremony. I love seeing the grandeur of the service, but I especially love seeing the people stand who have come in support of each candidate. I love seeing both clergy and laity stand proudly together in the presence of God and each other, promising their love and support to the honored minister as the Bishop lays hands on each candidate. One young man had probably thirty youth (and many others) who stood proudly for their friend and Godly leader. What a God sighting for those young hearts!
