

#### The Rector writes

Dear Friends

As I write this I am preparing the next service to be held in St Mary's on the 19th May, which is Pentecost.

How many of you remember the line in the song from Lucy in the Sky with Diamonds from the Beatles' Sergeant Pepper album "I get by with a little help from my friends"?

I always think it is a good song for Pentecost/Whitsun.

Pentecost is about us getting a little help. Indeed, on the first Pentecost when the disciples were sitting around fearful, dazed and confused, what the Holy Spirit seems to have done is give them help to get out there, live as Jesus had told them and pass on the good news.

The Christian faith is not about believing 101 very odd things before breakfast. It believes the world and universe is not here by chance – the force and energy behind it, which we call God, is one of love. Jesus shows that not only in word, but in how he lives and dies. And we are to show that love in our lives.

Which is where, if you are anything like me, a little bit of help is needed! Because actually, and in truth, I am often not very good at it. I have a natural inclination to put myself, my views, my needs first. That is true of almost all of us. And it explains a lot of why society seems so challenging and difficult – because all our individual wanting our needs met, means we are always fighting over the resources available.

So, I need help in trying to put others first, to be loving, forgiving, gracious and charitable. And in my experience that is what the Holy Spirit can be about – helping me to grow in those things. This is not claiming a magic box of tricks, part of the journey is getting it wrong and trying again. But I do feel reflecting on the love Jesus shows, and with the Spirit helping me know about God's love and forgiveness and challenging me in the right sense, then at least I can try and go in the right direction.

Early June has one of my favourite saint's day, who can help with this: St Barnabas is remembered on 11th June. He is known as the son of encouragement – because when the early church was struggling and sometimes arguing, he was usually to be found, bringing people back to listen to one another and just working hard and loyally for the faith. And I too need encouragement – as we all do, trying to live good, decent lives and keep body and soul together. And as I get older and bits seem to fall off, I need more encouragement. The church should always be a place where people find understanding and encouragement in the trials of life, (and I am always deeply shocked when the church falls short of that). I hope that people's experience of encouragement, care, support and love – are found in our churches here.

The vicar at our local church experienced some technical problems with the sound system one Sunday. Instead of starting the service as usual with 'The Lord be with you', he said: "There's something wrong with the microphone." Not hearing this, the congregation responded: "And also with you."

#### SEVERN VALLEY COUNTRY PARK

Our rangers and volunteers have recently been working on a nesting project and I've asked ranger Guy Border to provide some details.

The Common Swift has suffered a population decrease and in 2021 was added to the Red List of UK Birds of Conservation Concern. This is largely due to a reduction in suitable nesting sites. Research shows that swifts will readily use nestboxes positioned on walls, so long as they are high enough off the ground (at least 5 metres) with clear flight paths.

The Miners' bridge at the park was identified as a suitable structure to attach swift nestboxes to, offering enough height as well as clear flight paths to the river where the birds could happily feed. Swifts often nest nearby to one another so it was determined that more than one box would be fixed to the bridge, in order to hopefully develop a colony.

Our volunteers then set about making four nestboxes, as well as devising a plan to install the boxes without the use of ladders, which was deemed too unsafe. Once ready, the boxes were lifted up on poles and fixed to the bridge. In order to attract swifts to the boxes, our volunteers purchased a speaker which automatically broadcasts the mating calls of swifts for an hour at dawn, which has proven successful.

Fingers crossed that the new boxes are discovered and deemed suitable, so that the park can provide a home for this struggling species. We would like to give a big thank you to our volunteers for making this project a reality!

#### **ALVELEY STROLLERS AND STRIDERS WALKING GROUP**

We all enjoy walking the wonderful and varied network of footpaths which surrounds the village. However in the summer months a number of paths become overgrown and difficult to negotiate. A small group of volunteers do regular work on stiles, gates, and generally keeping the paths open for everyone, but there's a simple way in which each one of us can make a difference. May I please pass on to you this request from our volunteer group. As we walk on the paths around the village could we all tread back the nettles and soft growth, or if we use a stick hit the undergrowth back? This would stop paths getting too narrow and eventually blocked. It's one of those cases where a lot of small actions can make a big, big difference. Another way in which we can help is by having a pair of secateurs in our pocket so that we can cut off any troublesome brambles (they grow very quickly!) or small branches.

We might find that our walks take two or three minutes longer, but we can bask in the satisfaction of knowing that we are benefitting not only ourselves but also everyone else who uses those paths.

#### **ELLACOMBE'S APPARATUS**

The bellringers of today are generally a softly spoken, clean living, intelligent group of people. (Really?) However things were not always so.

Mediaeval bells were not set up for full circle ringing as they are today. The bell was simply clamped to a large block of wood called a headstock, this swung on plain bearings, often not greased, and the bell rope was attached to a short piece of wood sticking out of the side of the headstock. This meant that to ring the bell you just pulled the rope as hard as possible, and so bell ringing appealed to young strong men showing off to other young strong men. All of this meant they would work up quite a thirst and so drink would be taken after ringing and sometimes before and during with predictable results. (Disgraceful!) Even in the 1600s when full circle ringing, which required more style than strength, started to become popular, bellringing was still the preserve of men and men that often liked a drink or two or three. (Typical!) At this time bellringing was associated with secular occasions as much as with sacred ones and bells were rung for November 5th, for Oak Apple Day, for the King's birthday, for election victories, for horse races and in 1763 when a tax was put on cider the bells of Ledbury in Herefordshire were rung muffled on and off all day. (At Alveley we ring our bells half-muffled on Remembrance Sunday as a mark of respect).

Also at this time ringing competitions were organised by local publicans and they became occasions for gambling and drunkenness. Belfries even had their own jugs for collecting ale from the local licensed premises. Some of these receptacles still exist in modern belfries (shameful!).

Enter the Reverend Henry Thomas Ellacombe. At last - a decent sober man. Born in 1790, the son of a parson, he graduated from Oxford in 1812 and went to study engineering under Mark Isambard Brunel at Chatham dockyard. Mark was the father of Isambard Kingdom Brunel, perhaps the greatest engineer of his generation. He designed the S.S. Great Eastern launched in 1858 that could carry 4000 passengers around the world without the need to refuel. He designed many of the bridges and viaducts on the Great Western Railway (GWR actually stands for God's Wonderful Railway). He also designed S.S. Great Britain that eventually towed back from the Falkland Islands to be restored and put on display at Bristol, partly paid for by Sir Jack Haywood the then owner of Wolverhampton football club. But I digress. Back to the Reverend Ellacombe. In 1816 he had a change of career and returned to Oxford to study for ordination. He was appointed curate-in-charge of Bitton, a notoriously rough parish between Bath and Bristol. One night a lone traveller met Mr Ellacombe on the Bristol Road and immediately pulled out his money saying "Here is all I've got, please

Ellacombe strongly disapproved of his ringers' behaviour and don't hurt me." eventually got possession of the belfry key and it must have been at this time that he invented his apparatus. A hammer is mounted next to each bell and from this a rope, via a system of pulleys, leads down into the ringing room. On the wall is mounted a wooden frame 4 or 5 inches deep and roughly 2 feet by 2 feet square. The ropes from the hammers enter through the top of the frame and are secured to pegs, not unlike how guitar strings are tightened, in the bottom of the frame. Before ringing the ropes are tightened to bring the hammers close to the bells. Then by pulling on the ropes within the frame the bells can be rung. And this meant that just one decent sober man of the minister's choosing could ring the bells even doing simple tunes depending on the number of bells. This became known as Ellacombe's apparatus and the first one was installed in 1821. Now you would have thought that one of these would have been needed at St Mary's, given the number of pubs at the top and bottom of the village at this time, but no! It is installed at St Andrews in Quatt, a village that I believe has never had a public house. So the reason for its existence is unfortunately not the drunken Quatt villagers but probably a shortage of ringers or a minister that liked tunes played on the bells by one sober decent musical parishioner, or maybe both. 



#### SUSTAINABLE BRIDGNORTH

Sustainable Bridgnorth's petition against the potential closure of the local recycling centre was extremely well received and supported (with over 3000 online signatures and more than 300 on the paper forms at the time of writing). These will be compiled and sent to Shropshire Council when the consultation period is over. Thanks to everyone who signed and shared.

We are starting to make progress on training volunteers to be Energy Advisors, in collaboration with the Community Climate Connectors (CCC) project, which is being managed by the Marches Energy Agency (MEA). We would like to encourage anyone interested to get in touch (via <a href="mailto:energyreductiongroup@sustainablebridgnorth.org.uk">energyreductiongroup@sustainablebridgnorth.org.uk</a>) as there is currently funding to train more volunteers. South Shropshire Climate Action (SSCA) is also building a database of tradespeople who install insulation, heat pumps, and other climate-related services.

There are over 2,500 Repair Cafés worldwide, and several Repair Cafés have now been successfully set up in the county (and across the border into Worcestershire). We throw away a lot of stuff; even items that essentially have nothing wrong with them and could be given a new lease of life with a straightforward fix are often binned. If items no longer need to be thrown away because they are being used for longer, less energy and raw materials are required to create new goods, thus contributing towards a more sustainable society. Repair cafés can save people money, reduce landfill, teach fast-disappearing mend and repair skills, and fix those "non-usable items" deemed uneconomic to repair. Highley is the latest area trying to set up a Repair Café and is looking for volunteers to help with repairs or support (such as serving drinks and cakes - the 'Café' bit). If you're interested, then email repaircafehighley@gmail.com. At a later date, we hope to arrange a public meeting with various Repair Café groups to talk about their experiences and offer tips for anyone else wanting to start one up.

Sustainable Bridgnorth will be out and about at various functions, so look out for our stall. In June, we will have representatives at the St. Leonard's School Summer Fair. We will also be supporting the Mini Open Day at Pam's Pools. During September, we will have a stand under the Town Hall (instead of the Green Festival, which has been postponed to next spring). The group is still looking for more volunteers who can either participate in their various activities or provide support with Press Releases, social media, newsletters, publicity, etc. We are now meeting on the second Thursday of the month at St. John's Roman Catholic Church Hall at 7.30 p.m.

Supported by numerous environmental, animal, and climate advocacy groups and campaigners, the "peaceful, inclusive, legal and family-friendly" **Restore Nature Now** march is to be held on Saturday, June 22nd in central London. With support from organisations including the RSPB, The Wildlife Trusts, The Climate Coalition, WWF-UK, National Trust, Wildfowl & Wetlands Trust, Woodland Trust, Wildlife and Countryside Link, and Rewilding Britain, it hopes to be the largest-ever gathering of nature and climate supporters in the United Kingdom. The coalition want UK MPs to demonstrate strong leadership on climate change and nature both at home and abroad: polls have shown that nature, biodiversity and tackling water pollution are key issues and nature policies could affect the outcome of our next General Election. https://www.restorenaturenow.com/

Or contact me and I will get one to you. You can still go and visit other churches, even if your own church is closed (builders, lack of staff, etc).

This event has much more potential ... For example, Dorset raised £98,000. This is 260% more than us, and it has a similar population to Shropshire. Well, actually 30% more, but raising so much for their churches is amazing.

Thank you to everyone who helped in previous years. We (you) raised a record amount last year. Congratulations. We are progressing well.

I hope you can participate this year. Help preserve our Churches in good repair; and help to keep them open for the future.



On the Saturday evening we all went to a somewhat quirky restaurant - fortunately a table for 15 had been pre-booked, because the place was teeming. Quirky maybe, but the food was excellent.

During the weekend I learned a salutary lesson: be fully aware of what you are doing (and about to do). One morning, returning to the room after breakfast, I cleaned my teeth without paying attention. I reached into my washbag for my (sensitive) toothpaste, and put a squeeze on my toothbrush. However, I wasn't really paying attention as I was talking to the Head Gardener about our plans for the day.

When I started to clean my teeth I thought the toothpaste tasted unusual, removed the brush from my mouth and noticed that the toothpaste had a rather pink hue instead of its normal white.

Further examination revealed that I had taken the wrong tube from my washbag and was cleaning my teeth with Germolene.

Before the trip I had cut a finger and for some strange reason had put the Germolene and plasters in the washbag instead of the medical kit. It's the last time I will do that.

On the bright side you will have noted that I use 'sensitive' toothpaste and the Germolene tube notes that not only is it antiseptic, helping to prevent infection, but also has a local anaesthetic which numbs pain - a bit like sensitive toothpaste I suppose.

However, no matter how good an antiseptic cream Germolene is (other brands are available), I would not recommend its use for cleaning teeth. Look before you leap!


