Edward Horetski, 82, of Port Austin, died Wednesday, July 23, 2003, at the Huron Medical Center. Edward was born Oct. 29, 1920 to the late Edward and Agnes (Snazock) Horetski in Detroit. He moved to Port Austin in 1935. Edward Horetski and Margaret Fischer were married Jan. 3, 1942. Edward was preceded in death by his wife, Margaret, on July 31, 2000.
