Victoria "Tori" Miralda is Senior Manager, Space Programs and Mission Solutions, Lockheed Martin Government Affairs Corporate Field Office in Colorado Springs, Colorado. In this capacity, Tori is responsible for customer relations with Air Force Space Command (AFSPC), Army Space and Missile defense Command and NORAD/NORTHCOM. Her portfolio includes space control and mission assurance, space situational awareness, Cyberspace, Space-based Infra-Red System, Mobile User Objective System, and a variety of emerging capabilities. Tori joined Lockheed Martin in September 2015 after retirement from the U.S. Army.

Prior to joining Lockheed Martin, Tori retired as a Colonel from the U.S. Army, having served over 25 years in various positions leading Operations, Telecommunications planning and management, Space Operations, Strategic Planning, Program Management, Capability Development, and Cyber operations. Executive assignments included serving as the Director of Capability Development, Army Space and Missile Defense Command/Army Forces Strategic Command in Huntsville, AL and serving as the Army Service Component Command Forward Detachment Commander to United States Strategic Command, Omaha, NE. A native of California, Tori was commissioned in 1990 as a Signal officer, deploying in Operation Desert Storm as part of 1st Armored Division. In 2003 she became a U.S. Army Space Professional.

Tori's education includes a Bachelor of Science degree, French and Foreign Areas Studies, United States Military Academy at West Point in 1990; a Master of Science degree in Telecommunications, University of Colorado at Boulder in 2000; and a Master of Science degree in National Resource Strategy, National Defense University in 2011 during which she tracked IO/Cyber and won the 2011 Industrial College of the Armed Forces research award for researching the human biological response to Service Dogs as a method to treat Post-Traumatic Stress. She attended the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College in residence in 2003, was the Advanced Signal Officer Course honor graduate in 1994, the 82nd Airborne Division Jumpmaster Course honor graduate in 1996, and attended various space operations and counter-space courses through 300 level as well as COMAFFOR course in 2008 prior to deploying as the Deputy Director for Space, Central Command for 13 months at the Combined Air Operations Center. She also graduated from the U.S. Army Capability Development Course in 2012, and achieved Project Management Professional certification in March 2016.

Tori is active in Army Space Professionals Association serving as Vice President and on the national Board of Directors, and is a lifetime member of Armed Forces Communications Electronic Association, Association of the United States Army, and the Signal Corps Regimental Association.
