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Hotel Floor Plan



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COLONOSCOPY QUALITY MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (QMP) FACILITY REPORTS:

Current Status and Integrating OHPs Into the Program



Dr. David Morgan

Dr. David Morgan MD. MSc, FRCPC

Dr. David Morgan completed his undergraduate training in Human Genetics at McGill University. He did graduate studies including a Masters in Population Genetics. Undergraduate medical studies were completed at McMaster University and post-graduate studies including Internal Medicine and Gastroenterology, were also completed at McMaster. Dr. Morgan took an additional fellowship year with special attention paid to advanced endoscopic techniques, including YAG laser.

Dr. Morgan's research interests include dyspepsia, particularly with regards to effects of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs. Other research areas have included colon cancer prevention with COX-2 specific inhibitors and upper GI bleeding, particularly with relation to non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug use. He has published on such topics such as GI bleeding, quality of life in cancer care, use of proton pump inhibitors and the prevention of bleeding from GI vascular lesions. Dr. Morgan has participated on several CAG consensus panels dealing with such topics as CRC screening. Dr. Morgan is a member of several international societies and is a previous President and previous member of the Board of Directors of the Canadian Association of Gastroenterology. He is on the Executive of the Ontario Association of Gastroenterology (Vice President) and the OMA Section of Gastroenterology. Dr. Morgan is the Ontario Provincial Lead for the CCO/CPSO Quality Management Partnership, Colonoscopy. This group is tasked with developing a quality delivery framework for the province. Dr. Morgan has been a representative on several McMaster University finance committees and is a Past President of the Regional Medical Associates. Dr. Morgan is on faculty at McMaster University and is involved in teaching at the undergraduate and post-graduate levels. He is Head, Service of Gastroenterology at St. Joseph's Healthcare, Hamilton and is the Deputy Chief of the Department of Medicine.

OVERVIEW:

The Colonoscopy Quality Management Program (QMP) first released reports at the facility, regional and provincial levels in 2016 to all facilities providing colonoscopy in Ontario. Updated reports with more recent data, and with priority indicators and standards highlighted, were released in 2017. The facility report provides an overview of colonoscopy quality as measured by colonoscopy provincial standards and performance indicators at the facility level, alongside regional and provincial comparators. Standards are measured using data from an annual facility survey and indicators are measured using Ontario health administrative data. The report highlights where variations exist and where opportunities may exist for improvement. The purpose of sharing these reports is to encourage dialogue about quality within facilities and across regions to improve care for patients.



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COLONOSCOPY QUALITY MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (QMP) PHYSICIAN REPORTS:

How Should Endoscopists Use These for Quality Improvement?

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OVERVIEW:

In 2017, the Quality Management Partnership (the Partnership) met a key milestone when the Colonoscopy Quality Management Program (QMP) released physician-level reports. The QMP physician report builds on Dr. Jill Tinmouth's randomized controlled trial examining the effectiveness of physician-level audit and feedback reporting in improving colonoscopy quality. The report provides endoscopists with specific measures about the quality of their colonoscopy practice in comparison to peers and to targets (where applicable). The Partnership's release of physician reports is the first time in Ontario that all physicians in a health service area have received a report about their performance from a mandatory provincial program with an established performance management mandate. Alongside the release of the physician report, the Partnership has implemented processes to support physicians in improving their performance.



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REGIONAL PERSPECTIVES ON QUALITY IMPROVEMENT: Expectations for Colonoscopy Quality Management Program (QMP) Report Use and Impact on Quality Improvement in OHPs and Hospitals

Dr. Andrew Bellini obtained his medical degree and did his post graduate training in Gastroenterology at the University of Toronto. He has been in community practice in Brampton since 1997. His current roles include Medical Director of the Scope Clinic, President of the Ontario Association of Clinic Endoscopists, Chair of the OMA Medical Interest Group of Clinic Endoscopists, and Regional Director for Endoscopy for Mississauga Halton Central West.

OVERVIEW:

The Regional Colorectal Screening/GI Endoscopy Leads (regional leads) play an important role in supporting implementation of the Colonoscopy Quality Management Program (QMP) in Ontario. Regional leads are available to endoscopists and colonoscopy facilities in their respective regions to help them interpret QMP facility and physician reports and to identify areas for improvement and learning opportunities. In addition, regional leads have actively engaged a subset of endoscopists who may benefit from discussing their physician report and to work with them to develop a personal learning plan.



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WHAT'S NEW IN THE CPSO INSPECTION PROGRAM (OHPIP)?

Wade Hillier

Wade is responsible for three operational units, Practice Assessment & Enhancement, Applications & Credentials, and Membership Services, Corporations & Physician Register, plus one project unit Quality Management Partnership a joint initiative with Cancer Care Ontario.

Since joining the College in 2001 Wade has supported and led a variety of initiatives with the ultimate goal of improving patient and public safety by ensuring the development of clinical practice standards and guidelines, inspection of out of hospital facilities, improving access to quality physicians through implementation of pathways and processes for physician registration and by providing transparent information to the public through the oversight of the physician register.

Prior to joining the College, Wade worked in a variety of capacities at the City of Toronto where he led a large initiative on HIV and drug use in Central and Eastern Europe (working with CIDA, Medecins Sans Frontieres (MSF) and UNAIDS), and developed and implemented Canada's First Drug Treatment Court.

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POLYPECTOMY TECHNIQUES FOR ENDOSCOPY CLINICS

Dr. Kevin Waschke, MD., CM, FRCPC, FASGE

Dr. Waschke received his medical degree from McGill University. He subsequently completed residency training in Internal Medicine and Gastroenterology. After a fellowship in ERCP/Therapeutic Endoscopy and Endoscopic Ultrasound, he began working at the McGill University Health Center. He subsequently served as Director of EUS and ERCP and Director of Endoscopy. Dr. Waschke also pursued additional studies (Master of Arts) in Educational Psychology at McGill University under the supervision of Dr. Susanne Lajoie with his main interest being the development of expertise in teaching. Dr. Waschke has actively been involved in improving endoscopy training at many levels, having been involved in the CAG as the VP of Education (term completed 2018) and Educational Lead for the Skills Enhancement in Endoscopy program (CSI, TET and EPIC courses). Dr. Waschke has been involved in several ASGE committees related to endoscopy training and served on the ASGE Credentialing Task Force. Along with Robert Sedlack, Kevin has coordinated the ASGE STAR program.

OVERVIEW:

The focus of most colonoscopy training has been on improving intubation technique. Very little attention has been paid to polypectomy technique. As FIT programs roll out across Canada, there is an increasing demand for polypectomy training. The Canadian Association of Gastroenterology SEE program has created a polypectomy improvement course (EPIC) to address many of these needs. Various aspects of optimizing polypectomy technique will be discussed that are relevant to practicing Endoscopists in ambulatory endoscopy centers.

Dr. Nancy Baxter obtained her MD and PhD in Clinical Epidemiology from University of Toronto (UofT). She is board certified in colon and rectal surgery and a Fellow of the ASCRS. Currently, she is the Head of the Division of General Surgery at St. Michael's Hospital. She holds a Scientist position with the Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute and is a Senior Scientist at the Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences (ICES).

Dr. Baxter is the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs at the Dalla Lana School of Public Health and a Professor in the Department of Surgery and Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation at the UofT. She holds the position of Provincial GI Endoscopy lead for Cancer Care Ontario.

She is a clinical epidemiologist and health services researcher interested in the effectiveness of cancer screening, long-term cancer survivorship of cancer, and the quality of surgical care. She has extensive experience in the use of administrative data and cancer registry data to evaluate long-term consequences of cancer care for adults.

Dr. Michael Gould has a busy GI/ Hepatology practice in Vaughan and is a staff gastroenterologist at the Etobicoke Campus of the William Osler Health System. He is the President and Medical Director of the Vaughan Endoscopy Clinic, an endoscopy centre @ Pine Valley and Hwy # 7 in Vaughan Ontario.

He is the Vice President and a partner in the Toronto Digestive Disease Associates clinical research group, which has participated in many GI clinical research trials in all aspects of Gastroenterology and Hepatology, including Irritable bowel syndrome. He is a principal investigator on many trials.

He is a Past Chief of Medicine of the William Osler Health System. He is a past President and one of the founders, of the Ontario Association of Gastroenterology (OAG), and currently sits on the OAG board of directors. He is a board member of the Israel Cancer Research Fund. He was the Cancer Care Ontario Endoscopy Lead from 2011- 2014, and helped design the Endoscopy QBP. He currently is the Endoscopy Director at William Osler Health System.

He has been a member of numerous colon screening, guideline and quality committees at both a provincial and national level. He is a faculty member for the Canadian Association of Gastroenterology Skills Enhancement in Endoscopy program, and is a recognized leader in endoscopic quality. He is the co-chair of the OAG's Post Digestive Disease Week educational meeting, which occurs annually.



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THE PROVINCIAL POLITICAL ENVIRONMENT FOR OUT-OF-HOSPITAL ENDOSCOPY IN ONTARIO

Dr. Jeff Kolbasnik is a general surgeon at Milton District Hospital, with extensive local and provincial leadership experience including: President of the Ontario Association of General Surgeons (5 years), Chair of the OMA Section on General Surgery (3 years), President of his hospital's Medical Staff Association (2 years), and OMA Board Director (2 years). He has served on the ColonCancerCheck Steering Committee, the Endoscopy QBP Expert Panel, and the Endoscopy QMP Expert Panel. Dr. Kolbasnik has a busy endoscopy practice and performs both in-hospital and out-of-hospital endoscopy.

OVERVIEW:

This presentation will review the current political challenges and pressures facing out-of-hospital endoscopy in Ontario. It will outline the political environment within the profession (eg. at the OMA) and with the provincial government, including through current contract negotiations. We will discuss the regulatory and oversight environment, opportunities with provincial endoscopy programs, and possible funding options.
