"He comforts us in all our troubles so that we can comfort others. When they are troubled, we will be able to give them the same comfort God has given us." 2 Corinthians 1:4 (NLT)

So many within our Lewisburg District know the anguish of living through floods and their devastating aftermath. From Berwick to Selinsgrove, Shickshinny to Bloomsburg, and many other places, you have experienced returning home, not even sure where to begin. Hopefully, you also received help and encouragement on that painful journey.

My heart is breaking at what we see happening along the Gulf Coast. When our heart breaks for the plight of another, it is often when God wants to use us for a mighty purpose.

So I'm challenging us, as United Methodist Christians in the Lewisburg District, to shine the light of Christ in a powerful way by collecting Cleaning Kits (formerly known as Flood Buckets) to help replenish the supplies that will surely be decimated by the needs following Harvey.

Between now and our Cluster Charge Conferences, I'm asking you to work together in your church or charge to compile as many Cleaning Kits as possible. Place the attached list in bulletins and newsletters. Contact businesses and other organizations for help. Then, bring them with you to Charge Conference, and we will pray over them together before seeing that they make their way to Mission Central for distribution through our UMCOR partners.

Some of our churches may be able to pull together 2 or 3 buckets. Some may be able to collect 10 times that, or more. What matters is that, when we all do our part, we'll find that we are, indeed, better together!

### Ad Board Report

The Christian Education Committee will shortly be in a position to finalize the figures concerning the impact of this year's VBS on their budget and our church's finances. We need only some imminent reportage from Cokesbury as to the exact size of the refund for returned unused program items and a final reconciliation with Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church as to the balance of shared expenses.

We are considering a repeat of last year's Halloween-season Trunk or Treat outreach, and in the interest of the safety of the children, we may approach the Milton Ministerium about doing it in conjunction with other churches.

Bethany PSPRC, having completed its evaluations and recommendations having to do with the retention of the Pastor and the establishment of his salary for 2018, submitted to the Board both the memorandum of the Committee on the subject of retention and its detailed plan for compensation. The Pastor's retention was enthusiastically confirmed, and his new salary package was approved by vote.

In Traditional services, we are going to three hymns per Sunday instead of four, effective in October, and we're going to try forming a small volunteer choir each week to sing the middle song from the chancel. This is in keeping with the general feeling that we need more congregational involvement with our music rather than just more music. And we know from past experience that impromptu participation is welcomed and will succeed.

We draw nearer and nearer to performing an internal audit of the Bethany finances, which will take place as soon as our financial officers and concerned personnel are satisfied that everything is optimally ready in terms of reconciliations, income and expense tracking and transaction responsibility procedures, reportage formats and clarity, and the resolution of any issues. While we have made tremendous progress, there is much yet to be done. But work continues apace in that regard, we're in the fine-tuning stages, and we're fully confident that we'll come out of the other side of our efforts with a much improved overall system.

I'm sad to report that the Crossroads of Life Prison Faith Community in Central Illinois is undergoing an existential set of problems right now because of seemingly insurmountable barriers that have been put in its way by the Illinois prison system hierarchy. Crossroads has been turned away from prison access and has been denied the coveted chance to take Bible study and any other face-to-face ministry inside the walls of the very correctional institutions that it has served so lovingly and so ably from the beginnings of its efforts. So Crossroads is now at its own crossroads. And I and the other members of the organization's Board can only advise on new directions, make suggestions from afar, vote on procedural matters, pray, and hope, and continue in confidence that the work will go on in the best way and under God's direction and in his good time. I myself am confident that a new Crossroads of Life will spring out of the present crisis of identity and, in some as yet unforeseen way, will soon rebound to at last benefit those who need it.

The Bethany Prayer Circle has been slightly reorganized under the leadership of Sharon Foust and Judy Carl. Shirley Wesner has been added to one group in the chain, and Mike Longenberger, Jamie Aurand and I are now coming on as Group 6. These enlargements take on a lot of importance, because they magnify the already great power of Bethany prayer.

We're almost finished! After a lengthy renovation process, the new restrooms, kitchen and the social hall in the church have received the required final inspection by the Code Enforcement Officer, and we've been given our official occupancy permit. The required inspection of the kitchen by the Department of Agriculture still needs to be completed before we can use the kitchen for church functions and fundraisers.

Because many of the windows on the first floor of the Parish House did not open and close properly, and some were still the original windows, the Trustees have decided to have them replaced. Additionally window treatments will need purchased and installed. This should complete the renovations to the first floor of the Parish House. If you haven't seen the new offices please stop by and check it out. Our intent was to create a more comfortable and efficient work space for the staff and provide a private office for the pastor. Hopefully we've accomplished our goals.

There was a recent break in at Enterline's Florist. The person(s) took numerous keys, one of which was the key to the Center Street entrance door. For security reasons, the lock on the door was changed. If you've had a key in the past and would like a new one, please see Cheri in the office. 


